#### MESSAGE FROM THE MANAGING DIRECTOR

Dear Parents and Guardians

The saying "Change is the only constant" holds true for this time where the world is trying to come to terms with the effects of the Covid 19 virus. Each time one engages with the media one is bombarded with news, good and bad. Every time I've had to cope with uncertainty, I have felt that the best thing to I can do is to try and keep what is familiar as constant as possible.

When President Uhuru Kenyatta made the announcement to close schools, our staff went into immediate refresher-training to deliver education digitally. The response over the last two weeks from many of our parents, students and teachers has been very positive. When there have been problems, the teachers and the IT group have tried their best to troubleshoot and find a resolution once alerted.

All students in Year 4-11 should have received a copy of their exam papers, of which they were asked to re-attempt and then mark according to the memo sent. This would give them a fair idea of having gone through the exam paper and correcting what they had gotten wrong. Thereafter classes (KG – Year 11) were taught digitally by either face to face contact through Microsoft Teams or alternate digital platforms.

#### **School Holidays**

The school officially closed for three weeks from 21 March 2020 and should reopen on 20 April 2020, 17:00 for boarders and on **21 April 2020 for commencement of lessons**. In some cases, teachers may be sending some holiday research tasks. However, I have not made this request compulsory for all classes as I believe that children and staff need to have a well-earned break after a very busy and stressful second term.

During the holidays there are also online resources which are free which can be accessed by students:

- Audible Stories is available for children who are temporarily unable to go to school around the world. Listen to all audiobooks for free, with content ranging from preschool to classic literature, no download of apps, no login required, no ads, with languages like English, German, French, Italian or Japanese - stories.audible.com/discovery
- Free online virtual visit to 17 museums in Europe
- In response to the epidemic, Cambridge Publishing, UK, is offering 700 online reading editions of their books. The free reading period is until the end of May, and includes some Christian and theological works.
- Online Broadway Musical, <u>7 Day FREE Trial</u>

#### **Cancellation of May/June Cambridge Examination Series**

We have also been informed by Cambridge that the exams for the May/June series for Checkpoint and IGCSE have been cancelled. Our students in Year 6 and 9 will write their Checkpoint exams during the October/November series. The fees paid for these exams will carry across to the later series of exams. We are still awaiting further instruction with regards the Year 11 IGCSE examinations. We should have more clarity regarding the decision on these exams on **31 March 2020**. Please see attached letter which has been sent by Cambridge to our parents.

#### **Release of Reports**

All the reports were released digitally on Friday through the parents' portal to those parents whose fees are up to date. In many cases the username and password to the Parents' Portal unfortunately went to Junk Mail. Please check in that section if you may not yet have received your access details. However, if you experience any further problems, please contact me through the two email addresses shown at the end of this message.

#### ... cont'd message from the Managing Director

I am generally pleased with the results. However, I would encourage students to spend time reading during the holidays to improve their English skills. We are also currently in the process of purchasing the subscription of an online Mathematics program – Mathletics - which students will be able to access once the foundational work has been completed. Mathematics teachers will inform students once this program is available on how to use it to improve on their Mathematics skills. This will apply to students in Year 7-11.

#### **Covid 19: The Way Forward**

Due to the uncertainty of the situation regarding Covid 19, I will be communicating with parents during the holidays. Should Kenya go into a lockdown situation, as has happened in many countries, we will resume our remote teaching in earnest at the start of next term on 21 April 2020.










#### **Indoor Games and Activities**

#### **GO ON AN ALPHABET SCAVENGER HUNT**

Make a poster with the alphabet and have your child search for items that begin with each letter.

#### **PLAY HOPSCOTCH IN A HALLWAY**

Use any paper you have on hand (or cardboard) to cut out shapes. Use double sided tape to place the shapes on the floor to begin your game of hopscotch.

#### **CREATE A OBSTACLE COURSE**

Use items around your house (pillows, pool noodles, baskets, etc) to create a fun obstacle course.

#### **PLAY THE FLOOR IS LAVA**

Decide which furniture is ok to jump on and considered safe. Set a timer and the first person yells, "The floor is lava." All other players must get to the "safe" spot before the time runs out.

#### **GO ON AN ANIMAL SAFARI**

Draw or print different animal shapes and have your child color them in. Hide them around the house for your child to find.

#### **PLAY I SPY CLEANUP**

Set a time to put away as many items until the clock runs out. Call out an item for your child to race towards, grab, and put away!

#### PLAY A FLASHCARD HIDE AND SEEK

For younger children, hide flashcards of letters and numbers around the house. Have your child find the cards and tell you the letter or number they found. For older children, hide word or math fact flashcards and have them tell you the answer when they find them.

#### **PLAY HIDE AND SEEK**

One person counts and covers their eyes (no peeking!) for 20 seconds while everyone else finds a place to hide.

#### **DANCE YOUR HEART OUT!**

Have a group video call with friends and do a virtual dance party. Use tools like Skype or Zoom.

#### **Indoor Games and Activities**

#### **PLAY MUSICAL CHAIRS**

Place a couple of chairs back to back and turn on some fun music. Players move around the chairs and when the music stops, the last one not sitting in a chair is out.

#### PLAY FOLLOW THE LEADER

Have your family take turns being the leader. The leader gets in front of the line with everyone else behind them mimicking the leader's actions. Get creative with your movements! Wiggle your arms while walking, march, bunny hop, etc.

#### WRITE THE ROOM!

Hide sight words (letters, numbers, spelling words, etc.) around the room or house and have children find and record them using clipboards.

#### **PLAY SIMON SAYS**

A person named Simon is the leader and gives out commands. For example, "Simon Says run in place! Simon Says crawl like a bear." If Simon doesn't start the command with "Simon Says," the players to follow the command are out.

#### **CREATE A SAFE PHYSICAL ACTIVITY SPACE**

If you have an open space like a basement, take an old mattress and place it on the floor for gymnastics or wrestling.

#### **PLAY RED LIGHT, GREEN LIGHT!**

Choose a start and finish line. Have everyone line up against a wall. Red light means stop, and green light means go! One person will yell out either command as everyone races to the finish line.

#### DO A "DECK OF CARDS" WORKOUT!

Assign each shape a different exercise. For example, Hearts = running in place, Diamond = jumping jacks, Spades = push-ups, Clubs = sit-ups. Take turns flipping the cards and doing that number of the exercise.

#### **PLAY CHARADES**

On pieces of cut-up paper, write down phrases or words to act out. Take turns pulling a single paper out of a container and have fun acting out the description.

#### **PLAY FREEZE DANCE**

One person is the DJ and in control of the music. When the music starts, start dancing but watch out! As soon as the music is paused, freeze!


