Adaptive Learning Program for Children with Special Needs

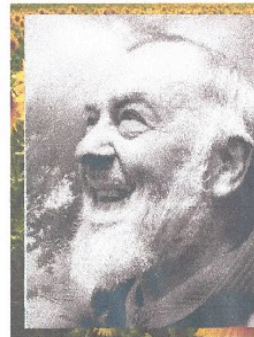
