

Equine Dentistry

- Teeth can often be overlooked when it comes to horse care
- Regular dental examinations and treatment are an important part in the health care of your paddock or performance horse. Sharp teeth can be a source of pain and in turn leading to difficulty eating and loss of weight. Sharp teeth can also lead to a reluctance to accept the bit and cause a horse to misbehave whilst being ridden
- We recommend dental check ups in most cases every 12 months. This will ensure that your horse can chew its food adequately and is not in pain to maintain its body condition

Dental procedure

- All our dental procedures are performed under sedation which allows us to examine all the teeth individually which cannot be examined without it
- A power float is used to improve the efficiency of our dentals to correct problems quickly and easily
- We can remove wolf teeth if needed with local anaesthetic blocks
- You will be provided with a dental chart if requested
