


## The Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN)

- Accuracy of data and statistics


### **Economic side:**


- Long tail economic recovery

(percent change)








### FIGURE 5: COVID-19 AFFECTING ALL SDGS


Q.1. In your view, in your country, what will be the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on the achievement of the SDGs by 2030?







# Palma ratio


Figure 6 | Palma ratio, 2006-2016








