Speakers:

• **Hugh Evans & Katie Porter**, Bristol City Council (stepping in for Christina Gray)

Introduction from David Smallacombe (Care and Support West)

- David said a lot of the focus of the call today will be on the breakout rooms and there will only be one speaker which is Christina Gray (Hugh and Katie then put in the chat they will be taking over).
- David discussed the Care Association Alliance.
- David said Care and Support West have upcoming meetings with Bristol City Council, BANES Council and North Somerset Council so if anyone has anything they would like them to talk about then to email David.
- David said Care and Support West are at the Bristol City provider forum this week.
- David said they have a data security protection tool call later this week about how they are going to be working with them.
- David said one of the breakout rooms today is talking about visiting, he said he is interested to hear about the issues people are facing.

Sophie Chester-Glyn (Coproduce Care and Manor Community)

- Sophie said the 4 breakout room topics for today would be IPC grant future use,
 Collaborating for funding, Visiting and Top 3 challenges now.
- Sophie explained the Act for care, Colour of care livestreams that Coproduce Care are doing and she said they are doing one today with Clenton Farquharson, Dudley Sawyerr and Sue Ann Nnamani. Sophie said the livestreams are always free and are always available for everyone to join in.

- Sophie said they will be doing another livestream on the 4th November with the Chief Executive from Skills for Care, Oonagh Smyth and they will be discussing the new Skills for Care report coming out.
- Sophie said the next livestream after that will be on the 9th November with Cllr Asher Craig and they will be discussing a few different things and everything that Asher is doing in the community. Sophie said the livestreams are good because you can interact and ask questions.
- Sophie said the speakers for the next call on Wednesday 11th November will be: Gerald Hunt from North Somerset Council, Kate Barnes from South Glos Council, Jon Shaw from South Glos Council and Mei-Ling Huang from Royds Withy King.

Hugh Evans & Katie Porter (Bristol City Council)

- Hugh said that Christina is very sorry to not be available today. He said she's updated him on a few things then Katie will join in after.
- Hugh said there has been a significant increase in covid-19. He said that Christina
 is currently working with Marvin at the moment. Hugh said that hospitals are
 working at reduced levels of capacity, whilst infection rates are increasing.
- Hugh said he is pleased to say that care home levels are still low thanks to
 everyone's efforts. He said this could change but to just keep doing what you are
 doing now. Hugh said himself and Christina are questioning why there is not
 equivalent protection for people working in home care as in care homes.
- Katie said the Department of health and social care have just come off the phone
 and said about the dom care testing. She said they want to pilot it for 4 weeks so
 they will now need to work out how many staff to residents etc there is.
- Katie said the rates are going up and this is mostly from household spread.

Q. What is the situation with supported living as well and how many cases are there now?

A. Katy said that with extra care and supported living, there are a couple of problems with the data not being right but it is being worked on. Katy said the latest cases are there are 1,324 positives and the rate is about 340. She said that testing sites locally are working well.

Q. Will the additional staff testing be just for Dom care or will it include all CSS provision?

A. Katy said the pilot they are doing is with Dom care, she said they need to do it really quickly with big providers then they can roll it out to smaller providers.

Q. Are other places doing this trial or are we the first?

A. Katy said yes, we are the first.

Q. How close are we to tier 2?

A. Hugh said we are close, he said the mayor is having a live conference now which is about the potential of moving to tier 2.

Q. If we do move tiers, can we have regular comms from the council?

A. Hugh said of course and said that Carol Watson was saying they can do a comms every week and they will also do whatever is necessary.

Q. How much time will we get to be informed before we moved into another tier?

A. Hugh said these things are always being negotiated, he said there are heated conversations going on all the time and each time they are different depending on circumstances of the place.

Breakout rooms

- Group 1 said they spoke about the infection control grant and discussed the
 differences between Dom and Residential. They said they speculated about the
 future payment and what they were going to do with it. The said the concern is
 what do they use it for and what actually happens when the money runs out. They
 also said they spoke about staffing and training too.
- Group 2 said they spoke about Collaboration. They said a couple of people were spending a lot of money on PPE, they said one home said their bill went up by £70,000 and said safety was the main factor. They said they talked about iPads and how they felt they came too late, they said out of the 6 of them in the group none of them used the iPad offer. They said their group feedback was they would like to choose what group they can go in to as it's not always the most appropriate group for the person. Sophie said they weren't sure how to move people around to certain groups yet but did say people can talk about anything different if they wanted to.
- Group 3 said they spoke about visiting but also touched on vacancies. 2 of the
 providers were assisted living, one was nursing and one was residential. They said
 visiting was not a huge issue for assisted living but it was a huge issue for the
 nursing home. They said it was a good opportunity to talk about many things. They
 said they spoke about visiting in gardens and how some didn't let people into the
 house at all during lockdown and certain people would have to do their jobs
 outside.
- Group 4 said they spoke about the grant and how much pressure is going to come, and what to spend the money on. They said someone made an interesting point about how they were concerned about how to advertise to staff and concerns about how staff will respond to the money being there. They said they also spoke

about visiting and how it is hard when people from outside the home have to carry out their tasks outside.
