

Ground rule

MOVEMENT for CONTROL

- Walking freely
- Walking & Body Control
- Walking until the leader stops
- Walking until a signal from the leader
- Changing walking direction
- Walking straight towards a target
- Walking blindfolded, carrying a basket, a little pillow or bean bag

WALKING ON THE LINE

- Simply walking on the line until the leader stops
- Walking on the line until a signal from the leader
- Changing walking direction
- Walking heel to toe.
- Walking heel to toe carrying objects with one hand then both hands
- Walking heel to toe carrying a tray containing flat or spherical objects
- Walking heel to toe carrying objects a basket on the head
