Royal Maritime Club history...

The Club was first established in 1851 on the present site and was known as the Sailors Home. It was instigated by well-meaning local citizens who were appalled at the way seamen of the Royal Navy were treated on their return home from two or three years at sea and was opened to provide respectable home comforts as well as a safe place to leave their money.

As far as is known, the prefix "Royal" was added in 1855 following a visit by the Prince Consort, following which Queen Victoria became the Patron of the Club. Charitable status was granted in 1883. It is thought that the addition of the word "Club" may have occurred just after the First World War.

On January 10th 1941 half of the building was bombed by enemy action and two months later on 10th March the remainder was completely destroyed. The Royal Navy decided to rebuild the Club and, through appeals to the Fleet and various Naval Funds, the present building was completed and officially opened on 4th March 1952, with additional floors opened on 17th December 1956 and the Families Annexe in 1962. In 1988, with funds donated from the China Fleet Club in Hong Kong, the Leisure Centre was created.

Throughout the years, the Club has evolved into its present form as a three star Hotel and has been able to open its doors to other categories of members & guests. However, the men and women of the Royal Navy remain as the beneficiaries of the Charity.

HMS Victory
