Rich Dunning spoke on the survey crew that was in in December for the Disinfection project. On January 31 there was a meeting with Crowley foods to discuss problems and housekeeping practices. We are both trying to improve communication between their staff and ours. They are going to put in \$60,000 worth of work for when there are issues and are going to tour our plant.

Mitch Cornish spoke about snow removal and getting complaints on a city worker who was snow plowing and covering sidewalks with snow due to driving too fast. The new bus shelter is being installed behind the Arts Center and will have put in at St. James, as well. These shelters are enclosed, lights and doors. The maintenance cost on equipment is getting out of control. Bridge NY will be shutting down Seneca Street from Monday, February 17 until July. Bridge closure won't affect Preston Avenue removal. South Division bridge sidewalk is waiting on the State to give the OK for re-opening.
