They have been applying sludge at Gerald's farm and reaching the 2 million gallon mark. They have not needed to make any trips to Wayland this year, thanks to the farmers in the area being aware and opening up areas for us. They have been doing ultra violet light testing. Good levels are 65% and we are getting 80% -85% transmittance. The equipment upgrade is creating an effluent quality that is above others.

Mitch Cornish

Working on UV and pumps – RFP/RFQ out for the end of the month. Fairlawn Ave. is being put back together. Curbs are in, binder is down and they should have lights in by October 31. They paved 10 streets this year and 45 in three years. Crosby Street is in dire need of reconstruction. It needs new water and storm/sewer lines and curbing, everything. They are taking the steps to get funding

for that, as it will be \$4.4 million to rebuild it. They are looking into other streets to pave next year. Hydrants will be flushed next week, starting on 10/21 with Hornellsville and North Hornell and then continuing into the City for the remainder of the week. They are looking at the downstream sidewalk on the South Division Street Bridge for repairs and sealing next year. Two weeks ago there was a water main break under Route 21. They hired a company to put a plastic line in there at a cost of \$26,000 excluding equipment and employee wages. There was another water main break on Seneca road earlier in the year. There were multiple complaints about the Shawmut Trail being overgrown. The Town of Hornellsville came in and mowed it back 4-6 feet.

Lenny Fucci

The plant is running smooth. They replaced a scraper drive unit for \$6,000. Currently there is no tank work going on, they are doing site work. There is an issue with where the tank will go, the machine that wraps it in wire and there not being enough room. They might have to move the tank.

The Mayor spoke of how the shrubs and bushes have been torn out of Broadway. They plan to grind the stumps, put in benches and new plantings next year. Route 36 will be addressed next year, as well.
