Youth Voice Program Puts Teens on Radio

Through a partnership with WSKG and their Youth Voice: American Graduate Edition program, Club members had the rare opportunity to research, write, and record NPR-style segments to be aired on the radio. The teens' radio stories addressed topics such as becoming a first-generation college student, and they learned how to use state-of-the-art field recording equipment to record each other's audio. Grants Fund New Van

We were recently able to replace an aging 7-passenger van with a new 15-passenger van. The new vehicle allows us to offer more disadvantaged youth access to impactful off-site programming (field trips, college tours, job shadowing, sports tournaments) that promotes and enhances their development. The van was made possible through a generous combination of funding, including a \$18,375 special assistance grant from United Way of Broome County and the Helen T. Howland Foundation, a \$10,000 capital grant from the Community Fund of the Community Foundation for South Central New York, and a \$2,000 grant from Binghamton University's Learning by Giving Foundation and Philanthropy Incubator program.

Golf Program in Full Swing

Thanks to a PGA Sports Academy program grant, our youth are learning the fundamentals of golf from Joel Deeter, the PGA Golf Professional and Director of Golf and Operations at Vestal Hills Country Club. Our Club members have the opportunity to train with Joel weekly and will visit his golf course at the completion of their sessions. This program is sponsored by the Professional Golfers' Association of America (PGA) and the United States Golf Association (USGA).



Restaurant Week Success

We received \$7,259 in proceeds from Binghamton Restaurant Week held in March. The funds will go toward our Power Hour homework help and tutoring program. On behalf of the restaurants, Marie McKenna from Lost Dog Cafe visited our Club in late April, where our members read thank you speeches and presented her with a card.

Club Members Explore Careers as Junior Staff

This spring we began our Junior Staff program, funded by the City's Community Development Block Grant program. This nationally recognized program through Boys & Girls Clubs of America, enables teens to explore careers in youth development and human services by shadowing staff members at the Club and serving as their assistants. Junior Staff participants work throughout the Club, including in the art room, games room, and dining area. In addition, youth engage in weekly Junior Achievement career workshops to supplement their experience.



Binghamton University Students Sponsor Carnival

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Binghamton Mentors, a Binghamton University student group, sponsored our annual Club carnival with money they raised through on-campus fundraisers. The carnival included an inflatable obstacle course and zoo mobile, as well as a variety of activities led by other BU student groups, including face painting, friendship bracelets, and carnival games. A capella groups from the university provided additional performance entertainment for our members. Over 275 youth and 50 volunteers attended the carnival.
