I knew absolutely nothing about sewing, except that for the prior 15 plus years any machine I dared touch found a way to talk back at me. Jonathan was considered an expert by then, having put in nearly a decade in the trade, but I knew no difference between a size 80 and a size 12 needle (spoiler alert...there isn't any!).

Those early days - thrown in the deep end - I spent as much time re-asking the same questions as the customers that kept asking me. But within a few months the answers I realized were - mostly - the same. It took several repetitions, but by being exposed repetitively, and recognizing the need to learn, I began to assimilate the breadth of experience I now possess today. It didn't happen over night.

But now I'm back at square one and it is both exhilarating and frustrating. Everything seems to take eternity to do. I'm clumsy and awkward. I have to concentrate on each aspect, and I find myself having to re-read directions and my notes over and over, and over again. Someday I hope it will all be second nature; the knowledge of a skill set crafted by experience. The ease of expertise. Reliability.

For now, nothing works out guite like intended. I've made more mistakes than successes (at least that's how it feels), but there is a certain joy and thrill within that learning environment. It is that joy of discovery. That joy of play. Embracing being a Beginner is like finding your inner child (and maybe even some new toys).


