Behind the Photo of the Older Women in Waist-High Water

Almost as soon as the water began seeping into the assisted-living center in Dickinson, Tex., Susan Bobrick knew about it.

Ms. Bobrick, of Houston, has a sister who lives there and an employee of the center called residents' relatives to alert them that water was reaching into the single-story building.

That was a couple of hours before dawn on Sunday, when the water inside was less than an inch. Ms. Bobrick, 68, was told that emergency responders had instructed staff members and residents to stay put. But as the day went on, the water continued to rise.

Ms. Bobrick got a glimpse inside La Vita Bella after an image was posted on social media.

The photo offered a disconcerting tableau that at first glance was hard to believe: It appeared to show a room inside the center, with an old

popcorn machine, a black-and-white cat, a lamp and a table with bottles of water. Several residents appeared calm in their wheelchairs and armchairs.

But all of them were waist-high in murky water.

Timothy J. McIntosh, posted the image on Sunday morning. He told The Daily News, a Galveston County newspaper, that his wife's mother owned La Vita Bella and had taken the picture.

The image gained widespread attention on social media, where hundreds of people shared it, seeking help from emergency responders and local news outlets.

Ms. Bobrick said she had no doubts about the photo's authenticity; she recognized the center and the level of flooding matched what she had already learned.

"They did look sort of calm in that photo," she said. "But at this point in time they had

been in that water for several hours. When you get people that are in wheelchairs, or cannot get around, or they have walkers, if the water kept coming up, what were they going to do?"

On Sunday afternoon, Ms. Bobrick said, a center employee called with good news: An evacuation was underway and the residents — more than a dozen — were being relocated.

Ken Clark, a Galveston County commissioner, confirmed on Sunday that the residents were rescued, though he could not say for sure how many.

He said the furor over the photo was not what brought emergency responders to the scene.

"We knew about it before it hit social media," he said. "We were working on a solution for the nursing home, and it was in progress, so social media can sometimes leave one with the wrong impression."

And, now, a new photo has come out, showing the seniors happy, dry, warm, and safe

Dedicated Delivery! How These Pizza Hut workers Got Food To Harvey Victims

Amid the floods that ravaged Texas as a result of Hurricane Harvey, a few bright spots have emerged. This particular one comes with cheese.

Residents of Oak Lake, Texas, a village southwest of Houston, were stranded thanks to the floodwaters and many were in need of

food. So when Pizza Hut manager Shayda Willison looked into her restaurant and realized they could make some pies, she made sure her neighbors got fed.

"When I heard there were families in need, I knew we needed to act fast," Willison told news station KPRC. "I called my husband and asked him to

gather up kayaks and meet me at the restaurant."

Together, they ferried 120 pizzas into kayaks and brought them out to stuck locals. "The people in the houses didn't expect us to come," she said. "It was so nice to see their smiles after so much gloom."

Willison intends to deliver pizzas until the store

runs out of food, and posted a number of terrific pictures on her Facebook page.

The national Pizza Hut Twitter account even acknowledged the deed with an "attagal" tweet.

"We are so proud of our team for seeing a need, stepping up and helping the community in a time of devastation," Pizza Hut franchisee James Bodenstedt told KPRC.

Family Honors Grandma's Memory By Displaying All Of Her Quilts At Her Funeral

Margaret Hubl passed away last July in Nebraska at the age of 89, but it's safe to say her legacy will continue to live on.

You see, Hubl was a quilter. While some people make quilts as an afternoon pastime, she made them to communicate her love for her family.

This was very clear at her funeral, when her children and grandchildren decided to drape all of the quilts that she had made over the backs of the pews.

"Never did I imagine how many there were," Hubl's granddaughter, Christina Tollman, told TODAY. "We covered almost every single pew in that church. I never knew how many she actually made."

And while the quilts are special, the meaning behind them really takes the cake.

Hubl spent her life caring for her family. She had three children of her own, and then took in her sister-in-law's twins after a tragic accident. Hubl and her husband, Henry, raised all five children in a small three-bedroom home on their

farm.

Hubl initially started sewing in order to make clothes for her children, but as they grew up and had kids of their own, she had to make those kids something as well.

That's where the quilts come in. She started making them for each grandchild as they graduated from high school.

"She wanted us to have something to wrap up and keep warm in when we went away to school," said Tollman.

Hubl really thought about each person who would be receiving the quilts, too.

"When we sat down to go through her things we found this — I call it a pocket notebook. Inside it says whose quilt she was working on, what day she put it in the quilt frame and which day she took it out," explained Tollman.

And as Hubl's children

began to take care of themselves, she began putting more time into the quilts. They became a treasured gift for each grandchild on their wedding day.


"I actually have three cousins that are not married, and the day of her funeral was the day that they got to see their quilts for the first time," said Tollman. "That was really kind of a neat moment."

All of those hours and all of the thought — it was all worth it. Hubl's family now has something to hold on to, to wrap around themselves whenever they need to feel the comfort of their loved one. So while giving a quilt may seem so simple, it certainly stands out as one of the most thoughtful gifts.

"This is the love that Grandma made for each of us. This is what she made for each of us to wrap up in when we hurt," said Tollman. "When we miss her."





Another restaurant is looking to be open in September for World Alzheimer's Day.







'There Was a Fabulous Kiss'

When Carl Warner developed a crush on his high school friend, Abby Deutsch, he planned to ask her on a date—but just as he began saving money as a telegram messenger at Western Union, Japan attacked Pearl Harbor, and America entered World War II.

Warner enlisted in the Marines a few days after the attack, leaving their home in Miami Beach behind. It would be another 76 years before the two friends would reunite in-person, and, Warner, now 92, had some unfinished business to take care of when he laid eyes on his old crush on August 17.

"There was a fabulous, fabulous kiss," Deutsch, 91, tells PEOPLE. "If this is the way you kissed somebody after 76 years, then I'm going away and coming back in another 76!"

The friends came into contact again over the phone about 10 years ago, but their reunion in Sherman Oaks, California, where Warner lives today, was the first time they had seen each other since the start of the war. While their phone calls over the years reinvigorated their friendship, plans to visit were difficult bring into fruition. Thanks to a partnership between Wish of a Lifetime, a foundation that helps seniors fulfill their goals, and Brookdale Senior Living, the residential home where Deutsch lives in Florida, the two were finally able to make their reunion happen.

"My favorite part was the anticipation and finally getting together with him," Deutsch says.

When Deutsch arrived,

the two spent hours talking and taking in each other's presence, as they had wanted to do for so long.

"We hugged and we kissed, as I knew we would," Warner tells PEOPLE. "We renewed our friendship and talked to each other about what our life was like during those many years when we were apart."

During the time they were separated, Deutsch made it a point to remain active and find joy in each day. She worked at the University of Miami as a secretary to the school's vice president and raised children with her husband of 60 years before he passed away in 2012.

Warner spent years working as a foreign correspondent for UPI after his days in the military, where he covered dangerous stories which led to him being jailed in Cuba and shot in Venezuela. Walter Cronkite, the legendary CBS Evening News anchorman, twice reported that Warner died on assignment. Though he lived a life of exhilaration, Warner experienced heartbreak along the way. He has been widowed twice—his second wife of 22 years succumbed to chronic lung disease in 2015.

While much time had passed, the two friends instantly remembered each other when they were reconnected over the phone by a mutual friend about a decade ago. Though Deutsch says they were only friends in high school, Warner says that Cupid came for him at the worst possible time.

"I didn't have a car, I didn't have a job, I didn't have any money, how are you going to take a girl out?"

he says. "I desperately wanted to date her and I just took too long to ask, because right after I turned 17, I was off to the Marines."

Warner remembers Deutsch (whose maiden name is Silverstein), as a kind person with a great personality. She is still that sweet girl he knew so long ago, he says.

Before Deutsch departed to her home in Florida, the two friends took a tour of the Warner Bros. Studio Facilities in Burbank and had dinner at Warner's home (and he promised he would sneak in some more kisses before she left). Deutsch says their reunion was beyond her dreams, and she is delighted they were able to make it all

happen.

"We are fortunate we have lived so long and in good health," Deutsch says. "It's just wonderful—I just have goosebumps all over!"

Warner says their visit brought him back to a time when things were simpler. He admits he's having a hard time with old age, and he misses his career and the exciting things he was able to do. But, his few days with Deutsch made that disappear, if only for a moment.

"I've had a wonderful life, and whatever happens from now on, it's okay, though I'm struggling," Warner says. "But meeting Abby again was a delightful, wonderful and terrific interlude."



Husband of the Year Feeds Elderly Wife Ice Cream in 98-Degree Heat

As Brent Kelley, a dad from Nashville, TN, enjoyed ice cream with his own family in a local Sonic parking lot, he noticed an elderly man sitting beside his car with an ice cream cup in his hands - but he wasn't feeding himself.

The unidentified man had just draped a towel over a woman in the passenger seat, who Kelley took to be his wife, and slowly fed her the ice cream from the ground in 98-degree heat.

This is the kind of love you should hold out for. Run when you see those red flags. When you find that kind of love you should hold on tight and honor it everyday," one user wrote.
