Getting Married at St. Andrew's United Church These fees <u>must</u> be paid by the wedding rehearsal at the latest. (pay fees separately please)

Church - \$200.00
Minister - \$300.00
Organist/Pianist - 100.00
You must contact the
Pianist or Organist
and make your own

Janitorial fee - \$50.00

Music - The choice is yours and it can be played or taped. It will be up to you to ask the pianist or organist directly, if you require their services. If it is taped, it will be your responsibility to have someone in charge of this.

Photos - Only professional photos during the actual service but others can take photos during the processional, the recessional, the kiss and the signing of the documents. If you have a private video-person, they can set up prior to the service in a place that is non-obtrusive to the service

Rehearsal - Please arrange for a rehearsal time. Only the people actually involved in the wedding need to be at the rehearsal.

<u>Greeting</u>

THE KISS

Sand Or Grain Ceremony (If they want this) (you have two containers of sand, different colours and you blend them together by pouring them into another container, you could use different grains as well)

______, you have just sealed your relationship by the giving and receiving of rings and the exchange of a kiss, and this covenant is a relationship pledge between two people who agree that they will commit themselves to one

another throughout their lives. The most beautiful example of this partnership is the marriage relationship. You have committed here today to share the rest of your lives with each other. Today, this relationship is symbolized through the pouring of these two individual containers of sand one, representing you, and all that you were, all that you are, and all that you will ever be, and the other , and all that you were representing you, _ and all that you are, and all that you will ever be. As these two containers of sand are poured into the third container, the individual containers of sand will no longer exist, but will be joined together as one. Just as these grains of sand can never be separated and poured again into the individual containers, so will your marriage be.

Unity Candle Ceremony (If they want this) (you usually have two lit tapers and a central unity candle that the couple light together from the tapers. Sometimes a family member from each family would light the tapers, for example, mothers of the bride and groom. The bride and groom can also each light a taper and then light the unity candle together.)

about to light is a candle of Marriage. Its fire is magical because it represents the light of two people in love. This candle before you is a candle of Commitment because it takes two people working together to keep it aflame. This candle is also a candle of Unity because both must come together, giving a spark of themselves, to create the new light. As you light this candle today, may

the brightness of the flame shine throughout your lives. May it give you courage and reassurance in darkness; warmth and safety in the cold; and strength and joy in your bodies, minds, and spirits. May your union be forever blessed.
