We Make Moray is looking for representatives from Health & Wellbeing, Tourism, Business and Third sector as well as Arts & Culture to take part in a peer learning event to Dumfries and Galloway Arts Festival in May 2019. The visit focuses on working in partnership across the different sectors in line with Moray's Cultural Strategy and also supports the recently announced Economic Strategy for the area.

The visit will focus on different sectors working with the arts to come up with creative solutions for public and economic benefit as well as identifying further opportunities for partnership working.

In Dumfries and Galloway, DG Unlimited and The Stove work to demonstrate and support the vital role creative practitioners and organisations have in contributing to the wellbeing and economy of communities.
