SOUTHERN REGIONAL COMMITTEE ON STATISTICS,

ANNUAL MEETING

OCTOBER 1-3, 1986

CHARLESTON, SOUTH CAROLINA

The 1986 meeting of the Southern Regional Committee on Statistics (SRCOS), was hosted by the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC) at Charleston, with Jim Davenport presiding. An agenda and a consolidated roster of attendants and current SRCOS memberships are appended (Attachments A and B).

The opening business session was held on the MUSC campus beginning at 8:30. Introductions were followed by several announcements, including the information that liability on the Summer Research Conferences (SRC) is now covered by the A.S.A.

Chairman Davenport named an <u>ad hoc</u> resolutions committee consisting of William Schucany, Mike Kutner and Dan Solomon. A nominations committee for 1987 was also named: Dick Scheaffer, Fred Massey and Jack Tubbs. John Young was named chairman of a committee on invitations. Jim Davenport also circulated a list of committee memberships and requested members to make appropriate changes (Attachment C).

Tex Schietinger moved that the minutes of the 1985 meeting be approved as submitted. The motion was carried.

Clint Miller detailed information regarding the events scheduled for the balance of the meeting.

Don Burdick presented the Treasurer's Report, which was adopted (Attachment D).

A report on the 1986 Summer Research Conference (SRC) was submitted by Al Rainosek (Attachment E). Jim Davenport added that all comments on the SRC which had come to his attention had been favorable.

Dr. James B. Edwards, President of MUSC, welcomed the group to his campus and made generous comments on the role of statistics in development of the South and progress of its economy.

The meeting recessed to allow for the first round of sub-committee meetings.

At 10:20 the Committee reconvened.

Linda Malone and Hale Sweeny reported on plans for the 1987 SRC.

One anticipated subject which aroused varying comment was a proposed session on "short courses". Ralph Bradley spoke strongly in behalf of making the SRC more attractive by bringing in a prominent statistician as keynote speaker. Some members expressed the caveat that arrangement for such program additions be made with assurance of ample opportunity for interaction with the participants.

Dave Sylwester reported for the SRC local arrangements committee, providing information on the Steiner Bell Conference Center, ten miles east of Gatlinburg, Tennessee. The sessions will begin on June 14 with a Sunday evening reception and run through noon on Friday, June 19.

Tom Bratcher moved the subcommittee be given authority to approve up to five scholarships at \$180 a piece. The motion carried.

Clint Miller moved that registration be \$50, with a \$10 penalty for late registration and a fee of \$25 a day for part-time registration. The motion carried.

Fred Leysieffer reported for the Membership and Credentials

Subcommittee. Major discussion concerned outreach to non-academic contacts. Clint Miller moved that the subcommittee develop plans for a potential advisory committee from industry with a charge including attention to student training needs, research support, and industrial training needs, with probable arrangements for inviting the advisory committee to attend the SRCOS meeting in an observer capacity. The motion carried.

Clint Miller reported for the ad hoc committee on accreditation. He explained that the handout draft document "Criteria for Accrediting Programs in Statistics in the Southern Region" is modeled after procedures followed by the chemistry, engineering and computing machinery professional societies (Attachment F, which is not included with this mailing to attendees; the secretary will provide copies on request--EFS). He moved the formation of a standing committee with charges to establish an accreditation subcommittee membership appointment procedure, develop specifications for application procedures, define standards for undergraduate and graduate statistics programs, define financial responsibilities to support the accreditation process and develop long term or strategic plans for determining the feasibility of extending accreditation of education institutions in statistics to the national level. After some discussion, the motion carried. Jim Davenport appointed a standing committee consisting of Klaus Hinkelman (Chair), Clint Miller, Paul Minton, John Young, Dick Scheaffer, William Wilson and Harry Wadsworth.

The meeting broke for lunch.

After lunch, Clint Miller continued his report for the committee on accreditation and moved that a separate ad hoc committee on professional (individual) certification of statisticians be established. There was discussion centering on the validity of comparing the proposed certification with procedures followed by the American Society for Quality Control (ASQC). The motion carried. The ad hoc committee will be appointed by Jim Davenport.

The meeting broke for subcommittee meetings.

After the break there was a report by Piotr Mikulski for the Brochure Subcommittee. The group agreed with the committee recommendation that distribution to the A.S.A. membership be discontinued and also called for a rearrangement of institutional listings by grouping them according to state.

Dan Solomon, reporting for the Biometry Subcommittee moved acceptance of the subcommittee's recommendation that this subcommittee be disbanded. The motion carried.

Dave Sylvester, for the Econometrics and Management Science Subcommittee, reported that it did not meet.

Bill Schucany reported for Statistics and Courts of Law, indicating the Subcommittee has decided it will proceed with a bibliographical compilation on this subject and will continue looking at what might fruitfully be done on this subject.

Dick Scheaffer reported on the subject of Quantitative Literacy.

He detailed recent developments such as the changing state guidelines on mathematics education, with trends toward inclusion of "statistically related things" and progress in the training of wathematics teachers in the never approaches.

The next topic was site selection for future SRC's. David Allen reported on "Land Between the Lakes", in the vicinity of Paducuh, Kentucky. Harry Wadsworth reported on Unicoi in North Georgia. Colm O'Cinneide reported on Table Rock Lake in Arkansas. Tom Bratcher reported on a dude ranch at Ingram, Texas. Al Rainosek reported on a new facility at Gulf Shores, Alabama. Paul Minton reminded the group that Williamsburg is still a viable possibility. The group voted for Table Rock Lake in 1988. It also voted tentatively to plan for Unicoi in 1989 and either Gulf Shores or Brookley, Alabama in 1990.

The Friday session began with "3-minute reports" on activities at member institutions. Ralph Bradley reported in the absence of Lynne Billard who was visiting in England. Klaus Hinkelmann announced a conference at V.P.I. on May 25 and 26, 1987, honoring Jack Good. Larry Ringer reported that Ray Carroll has been appointed head of statistics at Texas A&M. Don Burdick reported organization of the Institute for Decision Sciences at Duke, which he now directs.

John Young reported for the Structure and Organization
Subcommittee. He indicated that the final revisions of the memoranda
of agreement had not been circulated to all members but could be
obtained from him upon request.

Paul Minton reported for the Guidelines in Teaching Statistics and Statistics Programs Subcommittee. Dave Sylvester read the text of a memorandum which he proposed sending to publishers, urging that statistics textbooks be bound more securely so that students can plan on using them as continuing references. He also prepared a letter to SRCOS members, asking for information on this subject (Attachments G and H). Clint Miller moved that Dave be authorized to send the letter in behalf of SRCOS; the motion carried.

Attention was called to a very well done video cassette on "Careers in Applied Mathematics", produced by the Mathematical Association of America. A series of topics (actuarial science, applied mathematics, mathematics in space, etc.) is contained on a single 1/2 inch VHS cassette which may be borrowed, for copying, from Dr. John D. Neff, School of Mathematics, Georgia Institute of Technology, Atlanta, Georgia 30332. The only charges are for return postage.

Fred Massey reported serving on a Georgia committee on revision of certification levels in mathematics teaching, where he found that major attention to statistics was emphasized in the revision because the committee was well-informed about "quantitative literacy", thanks to the efforts of Dick Scheaffer.

Dick Scheaffer told of plans by the "Reader's Adviser" to put a section on statistics in the next edition, throwing this out as a task of possible interest to individuals of the SRCOS membership.

Jim Davenport reported on a slide recruitment presentation, developed by Steve Ruberg which is designed for manual use but could be converted to videotape at minimal cost, possibly with individualized reference to institutions. Tom Bratcher offered to explore this possibility at Baylor.

Under the heading of old business, Ralph Bradley outlined various aspects of the Building Development Fund of A.S.A. in support of the projected headquarters to be constructed in Alexandria, Virginia.

Over \$1 million has been collected and pledged thus far, with an additional \$200,000 to \$300,000 needed to ease the situation. He urged vigorous promotion of the drive by SRCOS members. A room may be named (e.g. by a state) for \$50,000, a major room for \$100,000. Life memberships in A.S.A. are still available through 1987 at \$3,000.

Daniel Solomon reported doing a phonathon at N.C. State in behalf of the fund and Paul Minton called attention to the suggestion kit for state and local efforts which is available from A.S.A.

The next topic was a report by John Young on plans for the 1987 annual meeting at Lake Charles, Louisiana. The meeting will be at the Lake Charles Hilton. Transportation is most feasible by "hedgehopper" out of Houston, rather than New Orleans. Rooms are \$40. A Cajun Cuisine meal will be featured on Thursday evening. The dates are October 7-9, 1987.

Dan Solomon, in the wake of the Biometry Subcommittee discontinuation, moved establishment of a Subcommittee on Computing in Statistics which should probably conduct a survey on that subject, picking up on the survey conducted two years ago by Dave Sylvester. The motion passed. Membership was not determined but Dave Allen was suggested as the obvious choice to perform the survey.

Bill Schucany reported for the resolutions committee (assisted by Sylvester and Ringer) (Attachment I).

The meeting was adjourned at 11:00.

SUBJ: Quality of Textbook Bindings

At the 1986 annual meeting of the Southern Regional Committee on Statistics, great concern was expressed regarding the poor quality of bindings of statistics textbooks. The Committee is composed of the heads of more than 35 statistics departments and programs in the Southeast in which there are more than 100,000 student enrollments each year.

We believe that the 100,000 textbooks which are annually purchased should be retained by students to use as reference books. This requires that the bindings be strong enough to stand up to continued used for several years at least. Other things being equal, a \$29.00 text that falls apart in one year is not a better buy than a \$32.00 text that lasts for three years. To that end, we are collecting information on the failure rate of bindings of texts used in our courses as an aid in future text selection decisions.

Attached is the letter through which we seek to collect the necessary information on our current experiences. The summarized data will be furnished to departments through an appropriate report in the <u>Amstat News</u> published by the <u>American Statistical Association</u>.

We would appreciate knowing your company's policy and practices in producing books with an adequate life. We realize that the market forces include pricing considerations, but want you to know that a "stitch in time" belongs in the original production process rather than in the repair shops.

Publishers will be responsive if they realize that we believe adequate bindings are an important consideration in selecting a book. We need your input to identify those publishers and textbooks which require improvement in binding quality if their books are to be continued to be selected by us. Will you please assist our efforts in collecting pertinent data by sending to me the following information on textbooks you use:

- Text (author, title, publisher, edition)
- 2. Number of new texts sold this term
- Estimated number of new texts with bindings which have begun to fail by the 9th week of the term.

A basic dictum of quality control is to make it right the first time rather than to sort the good from the bad. With a concerted joint effort by departments teaching statistics, we can make it profitable for publishers to sell textbooks which have adequate bindings. Attached please find a memorandum to publishers addressing this issue.
