




Trim the bar code tab from the sheet of Magic.

This will be the base for your layout.



Cut out three 8"x1"
strips from the center
of the base page.



Set those pieces aside.



Trim a 10"x10" piece of Blue Dots.

Using a Silhouette or other electronic die cutter, cut out the "arrows" file. Save the small pieces for later use.


If you do not have an electronic cutter, this design is provided as a pdf for hand-cutting.




Trim a 7.5" x .5" strip of Yellow Stripes.

Trim a 3"x1" piece of Black Stripes.

Locate the three 8"x1" strips cut from the base page.



Turn the Blue Dot piece over and glue the strips of patterned paper over the arrow cut outs in the order shown.



After securing the strips, mat the Blue Dot piece onto a 10.25"x10.25" piece of black cardstock.

With a black journaling pen, draw faux stitched lines across the arrow cut outs as shown.



Trim a 12"x3.5" piece of
Red Stripes.




Adhere the red strip to the layout, 2.25" up from the bottom edge.



From kraft cardstock, electronically die cut the title block found on the "shapes" file.

Alternatively, trim a 6"x3" piece of kraft cardstock and decoratively trim the bottom edge.




Adhere the title block over the red strip, 1.75" from the right edge and 1.5" from the bottom edge.



Trim or print five photos to 1.75"x2.5"

Adhere the photos across the center of the red strip, overlapping the 4th and 5th photos over the kraft title piece as shown.

Choose two word stickers and apply them below the 4th photo.



Electronically die cut one tabbed note card from Newsprint and one from kraft cardstock.

Trim the newsprint piece to 2.75" tall. Trim the kraft piece at an angle as shown, saving the scrap.



If you do not have a die cutter, the notecard shape is provided as a pdf for hand-cutting.



Adhere the Newsprint notecard to the left side of the page, 1.5" in from the left edge and flush with the top edge of the red strip.



Computer-generate or hand-write journaling onto the kraft notecard.

Adhere the kraft notecard overlapping the newsprint card, aligning the angled bottom flush with the top edge of the red piece.

3" x 1/2"



From the scrap of kraft cardstock, trim a 3"x.5" strip.



V-notch the left end.



Adhere the kraft strip to the top of the title block, 1/8" down from the top edge.



With a black journaling pen, draw two rows of faux stitches onto the kraft title block, just above the top edge of the photos as shown.

THIS HOW I ROLL

From black cardstock, electronically die cut the "THIS HOW I ROLL" title found on the "shapes" file.

If you do not have an electronic die cutter, you can replace the title with letter stickers.




Glue the die cut title letters to the kraft title block, leaving a space between the word "THIS" and "HOW I" as shown.



Spell the word "is" in the title using red letter stickers.


Adhere three blue arrows that were leftover from the 10"x10" die cut piece, with them pointing to the word "is."



From Black Dots, electronically die cut the bicycle and five chevron arrows.

If you do not have an electronic cutter, this design is provided as a pdf for hand-cutting.





Punch out two 1" circles from Yellow Dots. Glue each one to the back of the bicycle tires.

Add two white brads to the centers of the bicycle tires.



Adhere the bicycle to the kraft title block so that it rests on the black faux stitches.



Using foam adhesive, adhere three black arrows to the left of the bicycle, with the points facing the bicycle.

Adhere the remaining two black arrows to the bottom of the far right photo with the points facing the right edge.



Destination

JUST ONE MORE RIDE?



Electronically die cut or hand cut the tab label from a scrap of red paper.

Locate the "destination," "just one more ride," and "we are here" stickers.



Attach the red tab label to the top tab of the kraft journaling piece using staples.



Apply the remaining stickers to the layout as shown or as desired.
