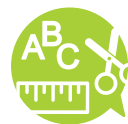

5.5" square, opens on bottom



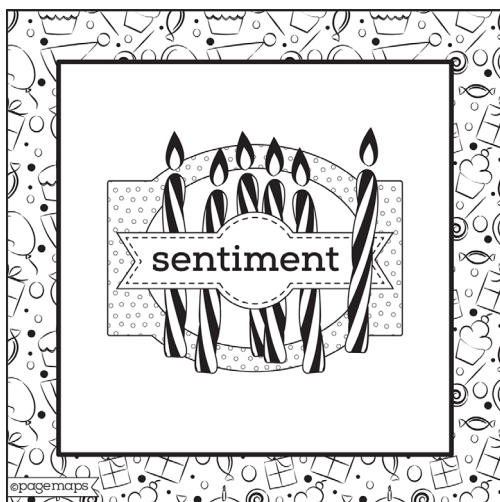
trimming dimensions

- 1 6" x 6" (base card)
- 2 4.75" x 4.75"
- 3 2.75" x 3.5"
- 4 2.75" x 2" oval
- 5 3.25" x 1"



card instructions

- 1 Make a 5.5" square card base from kraft cardstock, with the opening on the right.
- 2 Trim a 5.5"x5.5" piece of wood patterned paper. Adhere it to the center of the card.
- 3 Trim a 4.375" x 4.375" piece of yellow cardstock. Trim a 4.25" x 4.25" piece of multi-star patterned paper. Adhere the star paper to the yellow cardstock. Adhere the matted piece to the center of the wood piece.
- 4 Using the PMU exclusive die cutting file, die cut the frame from red/white petal patterned paper. Die cut the center oval from blue/cream striped paper (stripes running vertical).
- 5 Adhere the oval to the center of the red die cut. Using foam adhesive, adhere the frame to the center of the card.
- 6 From the Hey Boy! canvas stickers, adhere the wings piece horizontally to the center of the red/oval frame piece.
- 7 Using a 1.5" circle punch, punch out a circle from the red/blue/white starburst pattern. Adhere it to the center of the canvas wings as shown.
- 8 Using the PMU exclusive die cut file, die cut the number of your choice from wood patterned paper. Die cut an offset piece from yellow cardstock and adhere the two together.
- 9 Adhere the matted number to the center of the sunburst circle.
- 10 Trim out 4-5 stars from the multi-star patterned paper. Using foam adhesive, attach them to the corresponding stars on the card as shown.





cutting files

NOTE: cutting files are provided in .silhouette, .svg and .dxf formats and work with most leading electronic die cutters (Silhouette, Boss Kut, Cricuit Explorer, Pazzle, etc.) that can open these file formats. If you do not have an electronic die cutter, you can print this page and hand-cut the shapes with a craft knife or small scissors.
