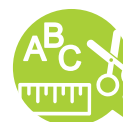

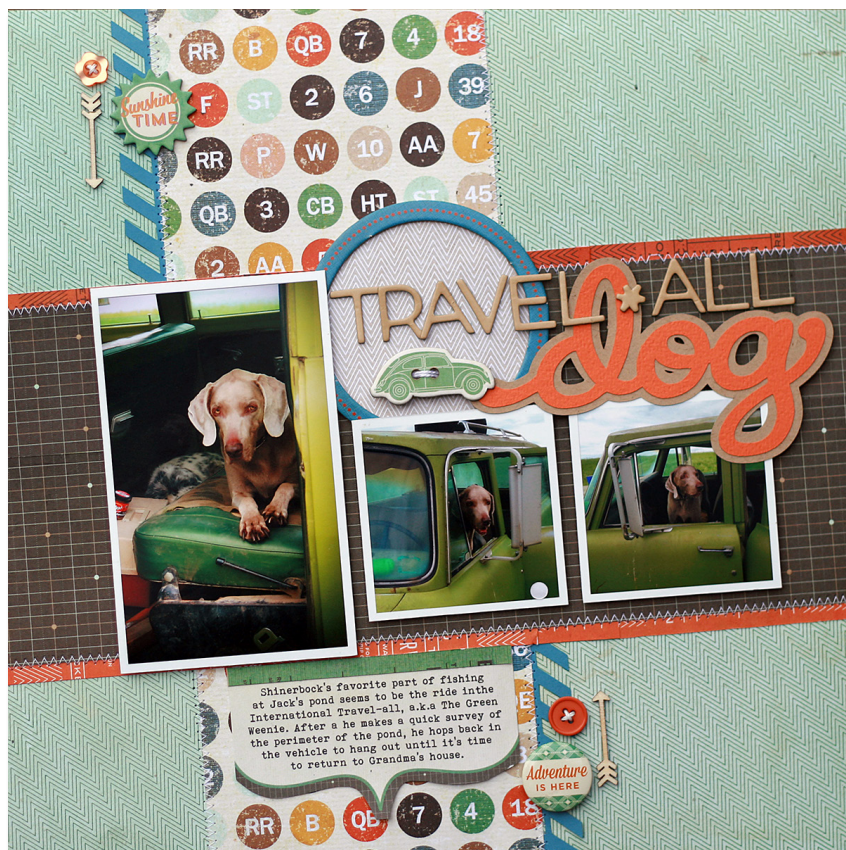

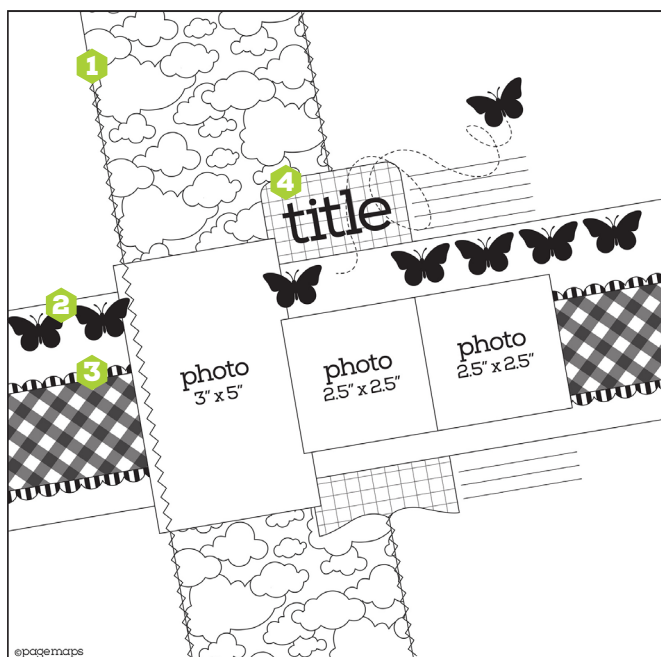

### trimming dimensions

### layout instructions

- 1 Locate a piece of BasicGrey Michigan Avenue (green tone-on-tone). This is your base.
- 2 Trim a 4.75"x12" piece of BasicGrey Rodeo Drive (large polka-dot) patterned paper. Trim horizontally across the middle to create two pieces. Adhere pieces vertically, but slightly askew, as shown, with the top piece 1.25" from the top left corner of the base and the bottom piece positioned as if the two pieces are one continuous piece. Trim excess.
- 3 Cut a 12"x5" piece from BasicGrey Bourbon Street (brown grid) and adhere horizontally across the page, but slightly askew and approximately 5" from the top, left edge of the base.
- 4 Trim two 12"x.25" pieces of BasicGrey Madison (orange) paper and adhere along the top and bottom edges of the brown grid paper.
- 5 Using the PageMaps U cutting file and an electronic die cutter, cut arrow shapes from blue cardstock and cut it in half vertically. Adhere one half

along the upper, left edge of the polka dot piece and the other along the lower, right edge of the polka dot piece as shown.

- 6 Using white thread, add zig-zag stitching along the vertical edges of the large polka-dot piece and along the horizontal edges of the brown grid piece.
- 7 Cut a 3.5" circle from BasicGrey Park Avenue (tan side) and adhere behind blue BasicGrey chipboard circle. Adhere to page, 2.75" from the top edge and 4.5" from left edge.
- 8 Arrange photos to fit within the brown grid paper as shown, placing the largest photo on the left, 1.25" from the edge. Adhere photos with foam adhesive.
- 9 Using the PageMaps U cutting file and an electronic die cutter, cut the title from orange cardstock and mat from kraft cardstock. Layer and adhere as shown. Adhere title piece above rightmost small photo using foam adhesive as shown.
- 10 Adhere tan American Crafts chipboard letters across the blue chipboard circle and the top of the die cut title as shown. Embellish circle with green BasicGrey chipboard car.
- 11 Print or hand-write journaling onto journaling tag. Adhere tag to bottom piece of polka-dot paper as shown.
- 12 Using an orange button, chipboard sunburst and wood veneer arrow, create an embellishment cluster in the upper left portion of the page. Finish button with twine as shown and adhere all three pieces.
- 13 Create a second embellishment cluster in the lower right portion of the page, using an orange button, metal flair and wood veneer arrow. Finish button with twine and adhere all three pieces.



### designer tips

- 1 When placing a strip of 12" patterned paper at an angle, divide the piece into two, leaving a gap between the two pieces. Then you will have enough excess paper to trim the top and bottom at an angle. Cover the gap with photos or embellishments.
- 2 After printing your photos, trim 1/8" past the four edges of the photo to create a quick and easy white mat.
- 3 Instead of machine sewing, draw faux stitches with a black or white journaling pen. Use a straight edge ruler and draw the dashes towards you, not away.

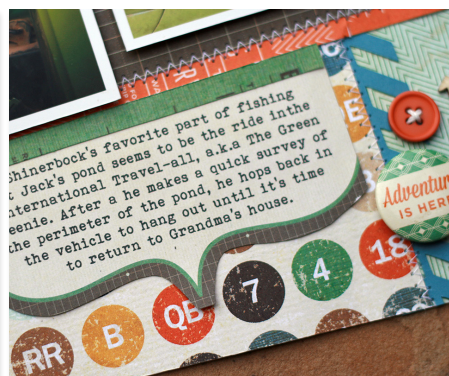




Clustering embellishments will add interest to your page and, when positioned the way Lisa did here, create a visual triangle around your photos.



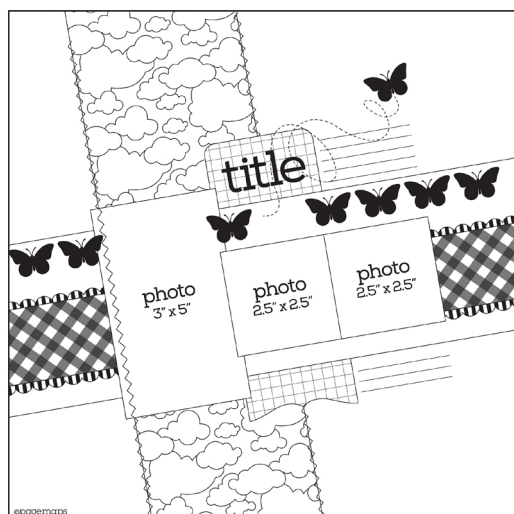
Lisa's zig zag machine stitching can easily be replaced with faux stitching using a black or white journaling pen.



Lisa's journaling tag was trimmed from a BasicGrey Snippets paper pad. She trimmed around the bracket shape to create an interesting edge.



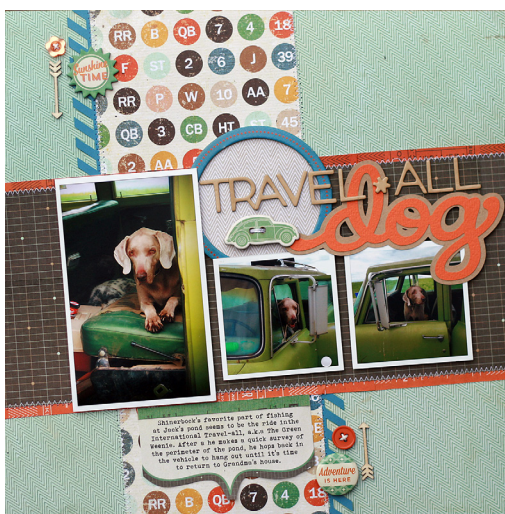
