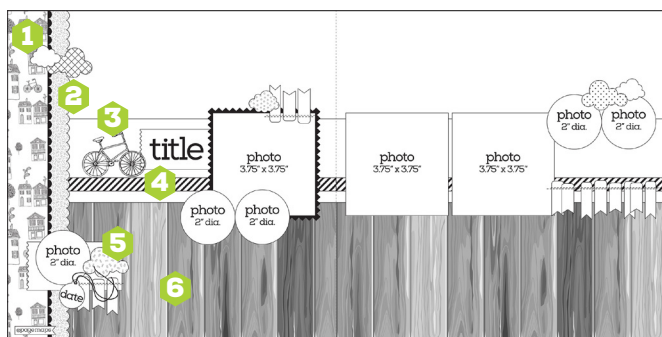

layout instructions

- Temporarily tape two pieces of pink cardstock together to create the base of your layout.
- Trim the Pink Paislee Hey Kid Hula Hoop die cut paper in half. Adhere one piece to the bottom of each pink cardstock page, flush with the bottom edge. Be careful to line up the circles (one section will be upside down).
- Locate the Hey Kid Double Dutch patterned paper and cut out the circle with the lips. Use dimensional adhesive to adhere the circle on top of another circle on the die cut paper as shown.
- Trim the Marco Polo paper (grid) in half horizontally, leaving the top design intact. Adhere the top half as shown, 1.5" in from the left side of the base and flush with the top. Adhere the bottom half to the right of the piece just placed, seaming the edges. Trim the excess from the right side.
- Trim a 3"x7.5" piece of blue cardstock. Adhere 2.25" down from the top edge and 4.75" in from the left edge of the base. Trim a 3"x12" piece of blue cardstock. Adhere to the right page, as shown, creating a seam in the center with the previously cut piece. Using a black journaling pen, faux-stitch along the top edge as shown.
- Trim a .75"x12" strip of dark aqua cardstock. Adhere 4.5" down from the top of the right page, keeping the right edges flush.
- Trim two 1"x12" strips from the Pink Paislee Hey Kid Hopscotch (yellow chevron) patterned paper. Adhere horizontally below the blue/aqua cardstock in one continuous strip.
- Trim 2" from the bottom of the Pink Paislee Hey Kid Red Rover (blue/die cut) patterned paper. Adhere the 2"x12" strip along the left edge of the base page keeping the blue side flush with the left edge of the base.
- Trim a 7"x6.5" piece of white cardstock. Using a black journaling pen, faux stitch along the edges. Adhere the 6.5"x5" photo just inside the stitching towards the top, leaving space for your journaling below the photo. Adhere the entire matted photo below the faux stitching on the blue cardstock.
- Cut two 3.5"x4.5" pieces of white cardstock. Adhere one Polaroid frame from the Pink Paislee Hey Kid Ephemera pack to each of the white cardstock pieces using vellum tape. Tuck one of the 3.25"x3.25" photos under each Polaroid window. Adhere each Polaroid piece onto the blue cardstock below the faux stitching. Using a black journaling pen, faux-stitch along the heart of one of the Polaroid frames.
- Trim a piece of green cardstock 1"x7.5" and dove-tail the left edge. Add journaling and adhere to the large white photo mat keeping the right edge in line with the right edge of the photo. Add three black chipboard accents below the journaling banner.
- Using circle punches, isolate the red, green, star, "smile" and "3" circles from the Red Rover die cut paper. Adhere the red circle first, centered in the remaining blue area of the page as shown. Adhere the green circle overlapping the red and going off the right edge of the page. Adhere the star circle with dimensional adhesive, overlapping the other circles. Adhere the "smile" circle, overlapping the star and photo. Adhere the "3" circle last, using layers of dimensional adhesive and overlapping the "smile" circle. Add a vellum circle from the ephemera pack along the bottom right edge of the photo. Place the "smile" sticker onto the "smile circle" to replace the edges that were cut off when isolating the circle. Add five chipboard accents along the bottom edge of the green showing below the circles.
- Using the cutting file, die cut a letter "S" from the back side of Red Rover (black chevron) paper and another from black cardstock. Mat the two letters, moving the patterned "S" to the left slightly to create a shadow. Adhere the matted "S" to the main page in the area to the left of the main photo, sitting just above the green strip. Add the letter stickers above the photo to complete the title.
- Mat the chipboard bow tie onto red cardstock and trim out the design. Adhere to the letter "S" along the bottom.
- Flip the layout over and use an xacto knife to trim along the center to separate the pages.

close-up photos



Marla chose a block style font for her oversized monogram letter. If you do not have an electronic die cutter, this is a simple, easy shape to hand-cut.

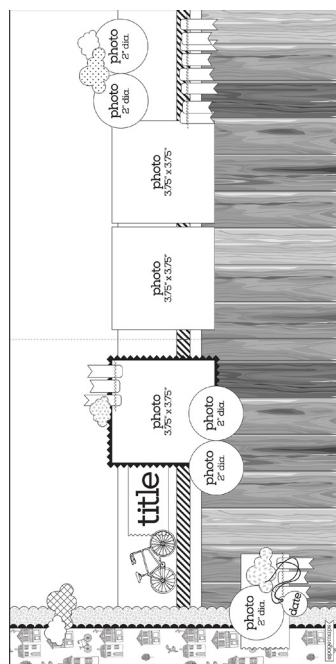


Concentric circles, in a variety of sizes, are so easy to cluster and layer with pop dots, creating lots of graphic dimension.
