

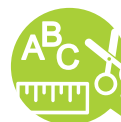

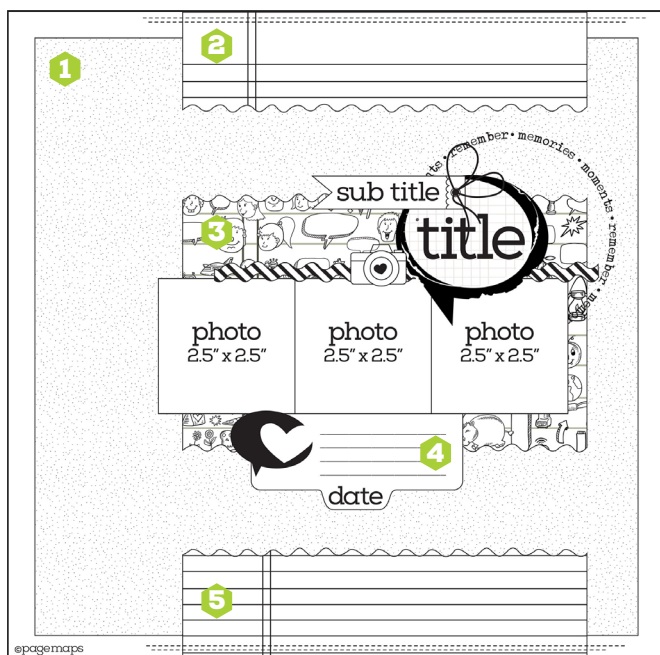

layout instructions

- 1 Locate the My Mind's Eye Remarkable Beautiful Delightful (yellow side) patterned paper. This will be your layout base. Trim an 11.5"x11.5" piece from Bo Bunny Vintage Dot Island Mist (green dot) patterned paper. Center and adhere to base. Machine-stitch around perimeter of the green paper, approximately .25" in from the edge.
- 2 Locate the blue floral paper in the American Crafts My Girl 6x6 paper pad. Trim a 6"x1.25" piece and a 6"x1" piece. Adhere the 6"x1.25" piece to the bottom of your page, 2" from the left edge of the layout base. Adhere the remaining 6"x1" blue floral piece to the top of your page, 2" from the left edge of the base.
- 3 Locate the white floral paper in the paper pad and trim two strips measuring 6"x.25". Adhere one strip tucked beneath the blue floral piece at the top of the page. Adhere the other on top of the blue floral strip at the bottom of the page, positioning it .25" from the top edge of the blue floral piece.
- 4 Using a scallop border punch, punch along the entire edge of a piece of white 12"x12" cardstock. Trim white scallop area to 12"x.25" then cut into two 6" strips. Adhere one strip tucked beneath the white floral paper at the top of the page and the other tucked beneath the blue floral paper at the bottom of the page.
- 5 Locate the gray text paper in the paper pad. Trim to 6"x4.5" leaving the top pink border intact. Adhere 2" down from the white scallop border piece at the top of the page and 2" in from the left edge of the layout base.
- 6 Trim a 12"x2.5" strip from white cardstock. Trim the strip into three 2.5"x 3" photo mats. Adhere photos onto center of white mats and set aside for later.
- 7 Locate the word bubble paper in the paper pad and cut out three word bubble shapes.
- 8 Using the PageMaps U cut files and an electronic die cutter cut the following:
 - one 2.75"x1.75" word bubble from yellow star paper
 - one 3.25" wide library card pocket from the pink "cute" paper
 - three 2"x1.5" cameras, one each from white cardstock, pink butterfly paper and blue floral paper
- 9 Trim off the top of the pink library card pocket, leaving the notch in place. Ensure when cutting that the word "cute" from the paper is cut near the bottom of the pocket.
- 10 Adhere the pink library card pocket to the bottom of the gray text piece, .5" from the left edge of the grey piece. Allow the pink piece to overlap the gray piece by .5".
- 11 Layer the camera die cuts as desired, using pieces from all three and leaving the center of the heart open. Add staples to keep the camera pieces together. Adhere camera assembly to the library card pocket, centering the open area of the camera over the word "cute" on the pocket.
- 12 Using foam adhesive on the color photo and dry adhesive on the black and white photos adhere the three photos in a staggered row, .25" from the bottom of the grey text paper and overlapping the library card pocket slightly.
- 13 Locate the orange "smile" paper strip in the paper pad and trim off. Notch the far right edge into a pennant shape. Overlap the plain orange strip over the hole from the paper pad, leaving the word "smile" intact. Adhere the orange strip, .75" down from the top right corner of the grey text paper piece.
- 14 Using a pencil, trace a 3.25" circle above the top left corner of the grey text piece. The circle should overlap the grey text paper and the teal base.
- 15 Place your clear stamping block over top of your traced circle and gently curve the "it's not about the perfect shot" stamp backwards onto the stamping block being sure to match the circle that you traced onto the page. Stamp the sentiment onto the traced circle. Let ink dry and then erase the pencil lines.
- 16 Add your title to the yellow word bubble using gold letter stickers. Using foam adhesive, adhere

the yellow word bubble/title block into the empty space of the stamped circle sentiment, overlapping the gray text paper on the top left corner.

- 17 Machine or hand-stitch the following:
 - Two or three rows across the top and bottom blue floral assemblies;
 - A straight line along the top, center of the orange "smile" strip;
 - A zig-zag line beneath the far left photo;
 - A zig-zag line on the top right pink portion of the gray text piece.
- 18 Using blue patterned paper, add strip journaling to the open area to the right of the pink library

card pocket, below the photos. Add stitching to each strip as desired.

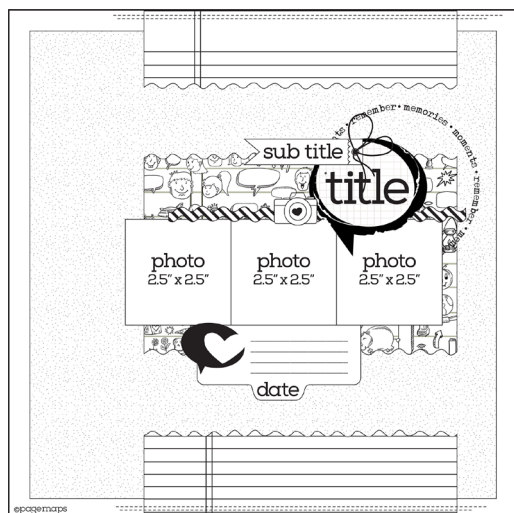
- 19 Thread two buttons with twine. Add the buttons and two sequins to the bottom blue floral paper assembly as shown. Add two sequins to the bottom left of the stamped curved sentiment.
- 20 Locate the three word bubbles from step 7. Adhere the two larger word bubbles to the layout, using foam adhesive. Adhere one to the top right of the pink library card and the other next to the title block on the right. Adhere the remaining word bubble just above and to the right of the title block as shown. Add straight line stitching as desired.
