Save Our Intercity Trains

Clirs Charles Royden and Wendy Rider have slammed the Government's double whammy of bad news for Bedford's rail services. Firstly, the government scrapped the full electrification project and then announced plans to axe peak time intercity train services from Bedford.

Charles Royden said "The government is snubbing Bedford and damaging the future of our area. Good links to London and other cities benefits local businesses and jobs."

The Government's plans to use slower, commuter-style trains to and from Corby instead of stopping the fast trains at Bedford and elsewhere would strip Bedford of the 37-minute link to London St Pancras. They would also mean trains to anywhere north of Kettering, such as Leicester, Nottingham, Derby and Sheffield would be seriously cut back and axed totally at peak-times.

Mayor Dave Hodgson said: "The Government's shocking plans to downgrade Bedford's satus as an Intercity station and end our peak time intercity train services must be stopped. Many local residents have made major decisions in their lives based on our rail services; decisions such as moving home or changing jobs. These changes would cause them huge disruption, and would harm our shared economic prospects."

"The Council will be putting a powerful opposing case together, and I will be working with anyone and everyone I can to stop them going ahead. Please have your say on the plans, and add your voice to the fight to save Bedford's Intercity Fast Trains."

The bus stop in Kimbolton Road, by Ellis Road, is the latest Brickhill stop to be fitted with Real Time Information. It informs passengers when the next buses will turn up, both Stagecoach and Grant Palmer. Cllr Wendy Rider said: "I welcome the funding by Brickhill Parish Council as it encourages greater use of our local buses".



Highfield, located in Avon Drive, Brickhill, is one on the residential homes now run directly by Bedford Council which have benefited from over £3 million of investment in improved facilities, like double glazing and upgraded facilities. Cllr Charles Royden said: "In this difficult financial climate it is important that we continue to look after our elderly residents and these improvements ensure that the vulnerable are protected".

Town Centre Good News!



Bedford town centre's footfall figures for the first half of 2017 show a striking increase of 5.3% against the same period in 2016, with the town on course for a fourth successive year of footfall growth.

Bedford and its traders continue to buck the wider nationwide trend of high street decline.

Help for Rough Sleepers

A new service has been launched to help rough sleepers in Bedford Borough. The service provides a combination of outreach support and assessment hubs where people can go to access help. It is a partnership between the local councils in Bedfordshire and Milton Keynes.

The new outreach team will work with individuals and, in more complex cases, mental health crisis workers will ensure more intensive support is provided.

Dave Hodgson said "Homelessness is a national crisis and this is our latest local initiative taken as part of our commitment to prevent homelessness. There is also the new Complex Needs Unit which is set to open later this year providing specialist accommodation and support for some of the most vulnerable."

43% Carbon reduction!



Under Mayor Dave Hodgson's leadership the council has reduced the carbon footprint of its estate by a massive 43% since 2011.

Dave Hodgson set the aspirational 40% target six years ago and since then a lot of work has been done. This included the largest energy conservation

project ever undertaken by the Council with work completed at Borough Hall, Bedford International Athletics Stadium, Central Library, the Kempston Centre and Allhallows car park.

There has been the installation of hundreds of solar panels, with over 200 installed at Allhallows alone and the construction of the River Great Ouse Hydro Power Station.

Wendy Rider said "This is a win-win situation. It's good news for the environment but it's also saving taxpayers' money on fuel costs."
