

## Lib Dems Demand Hospital Guarantees

Good news for A&E, maternity and paediatrics services at Bedford Hospital but Lib Dems demand no backsliding on announcement.


It has been announced that A&E, maternity and paediatrics services will stay at Bedford Hospital, under plans for the merger of Bedford with Luton and Dunstable Hospital.

**Mayor Dave Hodgson** said "We've been fighting for years against threats to remove A&E, maternity and paediatrics at Bedford Hospital, and this announcement commits to keeping those services. There must be no backsliding over these assurances. We need those services here in full, not reduced versions of them - and we need them here for good. If these arrangements do safeguard services, I will do all I can to make them work."

Local Lib Dems believe that residents need to know that vital hospital services will be there locally when they or their loved ones need them. Thanks are due to all of those who have fought to save Bedford Hospital from this threat and previous downgrade attempts.

**Cllr Wendy Rider** said "Government and NHS reviews, which have looked at downgrading Bedford Hospital and taking away key services, have dragged on for seven years and cost millions of pounds. It's amazing that the recognition that services like A&E, full maternity and paediatrics must stay in Bedford has come so late when it was so obvious for our growing population."

The government plans would downgrade the status of Bedford by taking away our place on the Intercity network and replace the trains with commuter style trains between Corby and London. 
Falcon Avenue - 'wildlife corridor'

#### Shock as Government Proposes Massive Increase in Bedford Borough Housebuilding Targets

Under government plans to impose new housebuilding targets on local areas, Bedford Borough Council will be required to plan for the building of 25,160 new homes by 2035, an increase of almost a third on current plans.



The shock figures come as

Bedford Borough Council is at an advanced stage in producing its local plan on the basis of an extra 19,000 homes by 2035. This was considered an ambitious figure itself, and was calculated on the basis of local need.

Mayor Dave Hodgson said "We've never been antihousing growth, because we know we need the homes that allow people to live in suitable housing for them and their family. But this is far in excess of our local need, and there's no mention of the funding for the infrastructure needed to cope."

"Quite simply, If the government goes ahead with this massive increase in our housebuilding target, it will mean a major extension of housebuilding across the borough, with huge extra pressure on local infrastructure."
