

Mayor's Congestion Busting Plan

A multimillion pound project to take decisive action to reduce congestion at the worst bottlenecks in Bedford has been launched by Mayor Dave Hodgson.

Dave Hodgson said "This is the largest ever investment in town centre roads in the history of Bedford. I believe that this plan will cut congestion, improve safety and help boost the local economy."

In preparing this plan various options have been analysed and considered, including the benefits of an extra road bridge over the river. A major in-depth traffic survey demonstrated that significant benefit to tackle congestion was best achieved not through any single project, such as an additional bridge, but by focusing on the worst traffic hot spots.

Councillor Charles Royden said "This major investment will improve transport in Bedford for everybody, whether you travel by car, public transport, cycle or walk. We will reduce congestion, improve journey times, boost our economy and revitalise our environment, including the air which we breathe."

Look out for a public consultation on the proposals soon.

Traffic Hot Spots Being Tackled

- 1. Manton Lane / Clapham Road & Great Ouse Way: Introduction of traffic lights and linking existing Manton Lane lights to control the flow of traffic and reduce congestion. Increasing capacity at Great Ouse Way junction.
- 2. Ashburnham Road / Shakespeare Road / Bromham Road: Introducing a traffic light junction to replace the mini roundabouts.
- **3. Britannia Road / Ampthill Road / Kempston Road:** Traffic light modifications to increase capacity for vehicles.
- 4. Cow Bridge (Ampthill Road):

Additional pedestrian/cycle bridges over the railway to increase road space and capacity for vehicles.

5. Cauldwell Street / St. John's Street:

Modifications and traffic signal modifications to improve capacity.

6. Ampthill Road Smart Corridor:

Introduction of a 'Smart Corridor' using the latest technology to assess traffic volumes linked to traffic signal controllers to reduce congestion and manage the flow of traffic.

Lib Dem Victory for Clamp Down on Cold Calling

The government have accepted Liberal Democrat proposals to clamp down on telephone cold calling.

The changes will see tough new regulations on claims management companies who undertake cold calling. A third of private phone calls in the UK are now cold calls, a colossal 2.6 million every month. This is a 180% increase in just ten months.

Councillor Charles Royden said "Cold calling is not merely annoying, it can lead to many vulnerable people signing up for things they don't want, don't need and can't afford. I am delighted that the government has accepted Lib Dem proposals in parliament on this issue."

187 New Classrooms Built So Far!



The incredible classroom building project spearheaded by Mayor Dave Hodgson has taken another big leap forward.

For many years local schools and their pupils have had to put up with temporary "mobile" classrooms. However, under the leadership of Dave Hodgson and the local Lib Dems this is becoming a thing of the past. Across Bedford Borough 61 temporary classrooms have already been replaced with new permanent buildings. On top of this many new classrooms have been built for the two tier change and to create extra capacity for the growing numbers of pupils. There have been 6 new schools opened as well since 2012 which are not included in these figures!

Councillor Wendy Rider said "In the past when the Tories ran the council the temporary buildings were allowed to become commonplace. Now we are overturning that and getting them all replaced and making sure we build extra permanent classrooms as well as new schools for the growing number of pupils locally."


