The incredible classroom building project spearheaded by Mayor Dave Hodgson has taken another big leap forward this year.

For many years local schools and their pupils have had to put up with temporary "mobile" classrooms. However, under the leadership of Dave Hodgson and the local Lib Dems this is becoming a thing of the past.

Across Bedford Borough scores of temporary classrooms have already been replaced with new permanent buildings. On top of this many new classrooms have been built for the two-tier change and to create extra capacity for the growing numbers of pupils. There have been six new schools opened since 2012, which are not included in these figures!

Charles Royden said "In the past when the Tories ran the county council the temporary buildings were allowed to become commonplace. Now we are overturning that and getting them all replaced and making sure we build extra permanent classrooms as well as new schools for the growing number of pupils locally."

Putnoe Walk-in Centre Saved!




Thank you to everyone who signed the FOCUS petition to save the Putnoe Walk-In Centre or took part in the consultation.

The FOCUS petition had 1,600 signatures and it is clear that it was instrumental in persuading the NHS commissioners, who had

proposed to close the walk-in centre altogether, to do a U-turn and keep the service.

The Putnoe Walk-in Centre will now remain open with the award of a new two-year contract to the Putnoe Medical Centre. However, the opening hours are being reduced on weekdays to 8am-2pm only (weekend hours are remaining as 8am-5pm). This is a disappointing reduction in service. We believe this could have been avoided had the commissioners handled this much better right from the start.

Wendy Rider said "Having faced total closure, this is a MUCH better outcome than we once feared, thanks to everyone who has fought for the Putnoe Walk-in Centre. We can assure you that we will continue to work with colleagues to argue for improved access to health services in our area over longer hours."



Wendy Rider reports "We asked for the fountain to be switched off during the summer because the water level became lower than anybody can remember. We have taken the opportunity to have the pond tidied up with silt and rubbish removed. The pond will fill up when we eventually have some rain and the fountain will then be switched back on".

Push for Council to End Use of Throwaway Plastic

Single-use plastics are to be phased out of all buildings and services at the council, thanks to a proposal from Mayor Dave Hodgson and his cabinet.

Dave Hodgson said "We have seen the impact of plastic waste in our oceans and the wider environment, so we must act to turn this around. We will be replacing throwaway plastic with reusable or more sustainable alternatives across the council."

The Lib Dem party nationally have called for the government to initiate negotiations in the UN for a legally binding international treaty on plastics.

and start weaning the world off plastics, adding that instead of leadership on the environment, all this Conservative government offers is empty words.
