

More Roads & [7] Pavements to be Renewed!



Mayor Dave Hodgson has launched a £25 million plan to improve the state of our roads and pavements.

Dave Hodgson said "Local people can see that in previous decades our roads and pavements were neglected by the Conservative-run county council. In many places you can still see the scars on our pavements from the cable TV work. Whether you are a pedestrian, driver, cyclist or motorcyclist we all need to use our roads and pavements."

"Over recent years, despite government funding cuts, I have made sure that work on our highways has been increased not reduced. Many extra roads and pavements have been resurfaced because of this. This new four year £25m programme will see even more of our roads and pavements fully resurfaced and renewed."

Charles Royden said "The £25 million is not for filling potholes but for proper renewal of the highway infrastructure. This is clearly better value for money than to keep patching the same roads over and over again. In Brickhill we have always made this issue a priority and listen to local residents about the areas most in need of work."



Action to reduce traffic delays in Kimbolton Road

Residents have raised with us their frustration at traffic delays at the junction with Putnoe Lane and Brickhill Drive. The delays have been caused by old signals and traffic sensors not working correctly. The good news is that these will be replaced and the stretch of Kimbolton Road from Ellis Road to Kimbolton Road will be resurfaced in summer 2019. For more resurfacing news, see back page.

In a massive U-turn, following campaigning by local Lib Dems led by Dave Hodgson, the government has agreed to reverse their plan for a £1.3m cut in funding for local schools in Bedford Borough.

Wendy Rider said "Schools still face national funding pressures, but this successful campaign will mean local schools avoid this massive cut that had been announced."

Manton Lane improvements

New School Safety Cameras

Schools in Bedford Borough have raised concerns about the unsafe parking and stopping on school zig-zag lines by a minority of drivers. These areas are specially designated outside schools to protect children and young people as they travel to and from school.

To support making these areas safer Dave Hodgson and the Local Lib Dems have allocated additional council funding to install enforcement cameras where feasible outside of every school that has zig-zag lines. In Brickhill, Scott Primary, Brickhill Primary and St Thomas More will all have these cameras.

Charles Royden said "A minority of drivers are putting children's safety at risk. There can't be any excuse for parking dangerously outside a school and we want to do everything we can to support schools in keeping children safe."

The Borough Council has announced plans to resurface these roads in 2019/20: Douglas Road, Hindburn Close,

Connaught Way, Marlow Way and Norfolk

Mowsbury Walk and some connecting footpaths are to be resurfaced. Work is planned between 28th January and 22nd February. Look out for diversions while the work is underway.

Mayor Dave Hodgson supports Action on Speeding

A speed detection vehicle commissioned by Mayor Dave Hodgson has been deployed in Brickhill and across the Borough to help tackle speeding on residential roads. The vehicle has already caught dozens of speeding motorists with some vehicles travelling at twice the speed

Wendy Rider said, "The borough council cannot enforce against

speeding as it is a police issue, however we are working with the police to identify speeding vehicles and passing the information to the police for them to record offending motorists. Information is stored on the police database and visits to the homes of offenders is a good deterrent which will help keep our streets safer."
