# Parking Charges Frozen Again



There will be no increase in council car park charges this year thanks to the decision by **Mayor Dave Hodgson** and colleagues. This is the third successive annual parking charge freeze and is a major boost for Bedford's retailers and shoppers.

This includes the two hours free parking deal. The deal was first introduced by **Mayor Dave Hodgson** in 2013. As well as two hours free on Saturdays in council town centre car parks, Queen Street car park is free for the first two hours <u>every weekday</u> as well.

**Charles Royden** said "This is great news for residents as well as our local town centre shops. I know that local people want to see a thriving town centre in Bedford and this free parking deal really helps. With the Queens Street Car Park offer, you can park for two hours free every day."

# **Emergency Beds for Rough Sleepers**

Rough sleepers in Bedford Borough will be able to access emergency beds every night throughout the winter. This means that for the second successive year in Bedford Borough accommodation will be available every night throughout the winter to 31st March, rather than just offering basic emergency beds in very cold weather.

This is on top of existing accommodation which provides 39 beds for rough sleepers **throughout the year** at the 'Somewhere Safe to Stay Hub' run by SMART in the town centre and the Kings Arms Project Nightshelter.


The announcement follows the opening of the 'Somewhere Safe to Stay Hub' which is open 24 hours a day providing short-term accommodation and wrap-around support for rough sleepers. A number of multi-agency professionals work together from the Hub providing advice from a variety of support services to help people get back into a home and living independently.

# Extra £500,000 for Renewing Roads and Pavements



At a recent council meeting Wendy Rider and Charles Royden voted for an extra £500.000 to be added to the budget for road and pavement renewal.

Charles Royden said "This is a top priority for us. Local residents tell us that more pavements and roads need bringing up to a higher standard and we agree. Despite government funding cuts to councils, this is still a priority."

## **Investing in Our Schools**



Mayor Dave Hodgson has launched the latest phase of the investment plans in our local schools. Over the 4 years from 2019 to 2023 there is a £27m of investment planned in new schools and new classrooms.

Dave Hodgson said "I have always worked with colleagues across the council to make sure that our local schools get the improvements they need. It is vitally important that old temporary classrooms are replaced with permanent buildings and new schools are built for areas of growing populations."

The recently announced plans include a new school for the Wixams as well as new classrooms in areas where school numbers are growing and to finish the programme to replace temporary classrooms.
