The Council budget put forward by Mayor Dave Hodgson and his team was passed in February with unanimous support from every Councillor, of all parties and the Independents.

In the face of massive government funding cuts - with the main government grant cut from over £30m in 2015 to under £6m in 2019 - it's a budget which protects those in need, with extra funding for care for the elderly and vulnerable.

Dave Hodgson said "As well as protecting those most in need, we have included investment in our children's future with all temporary classrooms we inherited being replaced and new capacity to avert the school places crisis seen elsewhere."

"I'm glad our careful financial management is recognised across the political parties on the council, especially when we don't have to look far to see a nearby Council literally facing financial collapse. We've had to take tough decisions that we didn't want to in the face of the brutal government cuts but we have protected services from the drastic cuts being proposed in other councils, such as widespread library closures or three-weekly bin collections."

"We'll keep fighting to protect services and put local communities first."

This budget includes the freezing of car park charges again and retaining the Saturday two hour free parking deal in the town centre, introduced by the Mayor in 2013.


Bedford Borough's core council tax will increase by 1.75% and the government's Social Care Precept will add another 2% on top of that. Overall, as we go to print, this is lower than the increases proposed nearby such as in Central Beds, Northamptonshire, Cambridgeshire, Milton Keynes or Luton.

Thank you to everyone who has already signed up to back the campaign to save the Putnoe Walk-in centre from closure. The local NHS commissioners have now given the centre a short reprieve but only until 30 September when they still want to close it.

Wendy Rider said "We are pleased that pressure has led to a stay of execution, but that isn't enough. We will continue campaigning to keep a walk-in centre in our area. It is an essential service and we cannot just let them close it."

Good financial management has enabled Mayor Dave Hodgson to redirect extra council savings made during this year to tackle high priority areas.



Extra £1m for Roads & Pavements



Charles Royden said "As we talk to local people in Brickhill, it's clear that the legacy of inadequate funding for repairing roads and pavements is of great concern. We already allocate over £2 million a year to this on top of the government grant. An extra £1 million will mean that even more resurfacing work can now be done."



Tackling Speeding



Wendy Rider said "Speeding across the Borough is a top concern that is raised with us by local residents. It's good news that at least six more pairs of average speed cameras can now be installed. We know many residents prefer this approach to the alternatives of road humps or fixed point speed cameras."
