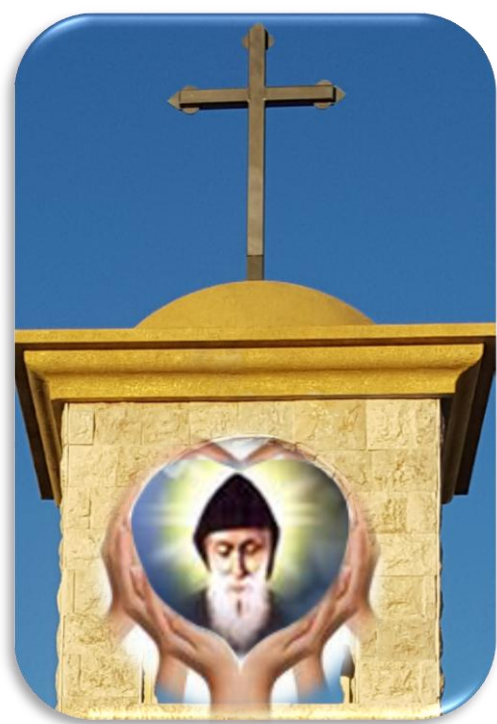

ARCHBISHOP AUZA: HOLY SEE CONCERNS ABOUT SITUATION IN MIDDLE EAST

On July 25, Archbishop Bernardito Auza, Permanent Observer of the Holy See to the UN, gave an intervention during the Security Council Open Debate dedicated to The Middle East, including the Palestinian Question. The statement was delivered by Msgr. David Charters.

In his statement, Archbishop Auza noted the ongoing violence in Gaza and the West Bank, as well as the distrust, dangerous rhetoric and extremist ideology that endanger both Palestinians and Israelis alike. Action, he said, is needed, particularly the care for Palestinian refugees as well as encouragement for both parties to return to negotiations. He noted the humanitarian situation in Syria and mentioned Pope Francis' letter to President Assad about the situation in Idlib. He cited the worsening situation in Yemen and praised the July 15 Security Council Resolution (2481) to strengthen the implementation of the ceasefire and provide access to essential supplies. He said that Iraq offers some hope of reconciliation and reconstruction.

The Archbishop's Full Statement

Mr. President,

Last month in his briefing to the Security Council, the Special Coordinator for the Middle East Peace Process, Nickolay Mladenov, noted a dangerous escalation of violence in Gaza as well as continued violence in the West Bank. Lack of unity on both sides as well as internal divisions is abetting an environment of distrust. Fueled by dangerous rhetoric and extremist ideology, this lack of trust can sadly and rapidly devolve into violent acts that put the lives of innocent Palestinians and Israelis alike at risk and negatively impact the tense wider region. Such a situation cannot permit this Open Debate to remain merely a rehearsal of well-known facts and commentary on troubling setbacks and impediments to reaching the much sought after two-State solution within internationally recognized borders. It must lead to action.

Mr. President,

Through generous donations mainly by means of UNRWA, the international community continues to ensure that education, health care, and other basic services can be provided for Palestine refugees lest the situation on the ground becomes untenable. There is already high unemployment and limited prospects for the younger generations, alongside an ever-increasing demand for food and water. Yet while humanitarian and economic support remain vital for creating the environment for negotiations, they cannot replace negotiations. Political will and constructive dialogue are required to establish the conditions for lasting peace and a comprehensive and sustainable solution. An important contribution Member States can make at this time is to encourage parties to return to the negotiating table and offer them space and resources to commit to dialogue as protagonists of their own peaceful future, side by side.

Mr. President,

In our consideration of the Middle East, we cannot overlook the still unstable areas in Syria, where the risk of a worse humanitarian crisis remains high. We cannot be deaf to the cries of those lacking food, medical care, and schooling, or to those of orphans, widows and the wounded. Yesterday, in his letter to President Bachar El-Assad, Pope Francis expressed his profound preoccupation for the humanitarian situation in Syria and, in particular, for the dramatic conditions faced by the civilian population in Idlib. He renewed his call for their protection and for the respect of international humanitarian law.

The worsening humanitarian situation in Yemen is also a cause for grave concern, in particular when those most in need are deprived of food and medical attention. The Council's unanimous adoption on July 15 of Resolution 2481 to renew the mandate of the United Nations Mission in Support of the Hodeidah Agreement was a needed step to strengthen the implementation of the ceasefire in the governorate and to facilitate access to provisions and essential supplies. There is a need for coherence, however. How can we make eloquent appeals for peace in the Middle East and even commit to humanitarian action while at the same time continuing to permit the sale of arms in the region?

Mr. President,

Iraq, after the unspeakable crimes that ISIL inflicted upon its population, especially members of religious and ethnic minorities, offers some hope as it moves forward along the way of reconciliation and reconstruction "through the peaceful and shared pursuit of the common good on the part of all elements of society."¹ In addition, it is essential that the international community continue to encourage and seek out every possible opportunity for negotiations and peaceful solutions to current crises in the Gulf region.

Mr. President,

This is a critical moment in which all countries of the region must not squander peaceful advances by falling back into hostilities sparked by the simmering conflicts of the regional powers.² Rather it is essential to promote even more "dialogue for a culture of tolerance, acceptance of others and of living together peacefully; in this way, they can contribute significantly to reducing many economic, social, political and environmental problems that weigh so heavily on a large part of humanity."

OUR HOLY FATHER POPE FRANCIS 'PLEASED' FOR INITIATIVE TO PURSUE GOALS OF 'DOCUMENT ON HUMAN FRATERNITY FOR WORLD PEACE AND LIVING TOGETHER'

With regard to the recent formation of a Higher Committee for achieving the goals contained in the *Document on Human Fraternity for World Peace and Living Together*, which he signed last February in the United Arab Emirates together with the Grand Imam of Al Azhar, His Holiness Pope Francis was pleased to learn of the initiative and has observed: "Although sadly evil, hatred, and division often make news, there is a hidden sea of goodness that is growing and leads us to hope in dialogue, reciprocal knowledge and the possibility of building, together with the followers of other religions and all men and women of goodwill, a world of fraternity and peace."

The Holy Father encourages the efforts of the Committee to spread knowledge of the Document; he thanks the United Arab Emirates for the concrete commitment shown on behalf of human fraternity and he expresses the hope that similar initiatives can spring up throughout the world.

Pope Francis and the Grand Imam of Al-Azhar on February 4, 2019, signed the *Document on Human Fraternity for World Peace and Living Together*. The signing following the Holy Father's speech to the Global Conference on Human Fraternity in Abu Dhabi, a key element in the Holy Father's February 3-5 apostolic visit to the United Arab Emirates.

"We cannot honor the Creator without cherishing the sacredness of every person and of every human life: each person is equally precious in the eyes of God, who does not look upon the human family with a preferential gaze that excludes, but with a benevolent gaze that includes," the Holy Father said in that speech. "Thus, to recognize the same rights for every human being is to glorify the name of God on earth. In the name of God the Creator, therefore, every form of violence must be condemned without hesitation, because we gravely profane God's name when we use it to justify hatred and violence against a brother or sister. No violence can be justified in the name of religion."

THIS PAPYRUS CONTAINS THE OLDEST MARIAN PRAYER KNOWN TO DATE

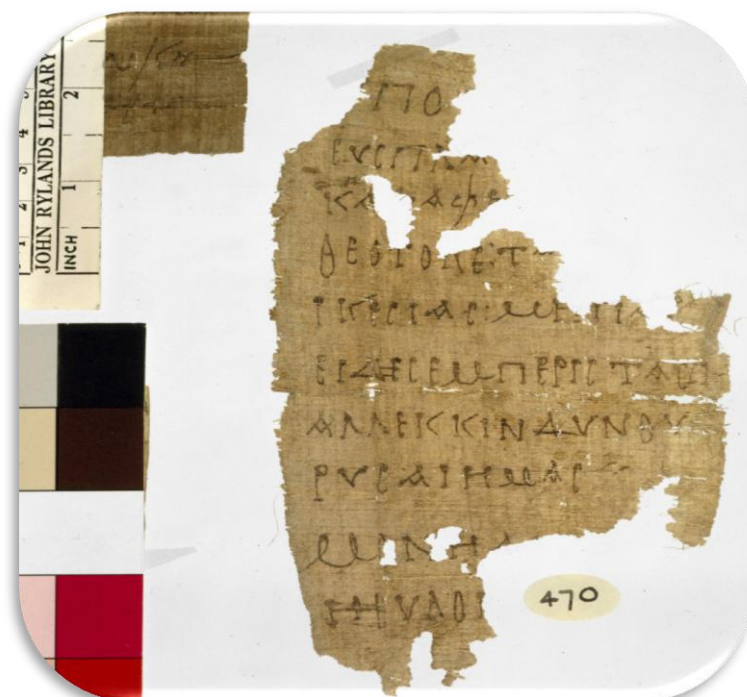
It is from the year 250, and is written in Greek.

The earliest known Marian prayer, like the Gospels themselves, is written in Greek. That is why, in it, the Virgin Mary is called *Θεοτοκος*, "*theotokos*," the "Birth-Giver of God," "the Mother of God." That in such early prayer the Virgin Mary is already referred to with this title is quite important, both from a historical and a theological standpoint.

This prayer, as explained on Trisagion Film's Website, was "found on a fragment of papyrus that dates all the way back to approximately AD 250," only a couple of centuries after the death and resurrection of Christ, approximately a century before Constantine and the Edict of Milan but, more importantly, two centuries before the Third Ecumenical Council, the Council of Ephesus, in which the Virgin Mary was for the first time officially proclaimed "Mother of God," *Theotokos*. In 1917, the John Rylands Library in Manchester, England, acquired a large panel of Egyptian papyrus, written in Koine Greek (the Mediterranean *lingua franca* in which the Gospels were written). The prayer is to be found in the fragment labeled number 470, and it appears to be from a Coptic Christmas liturgy (maybe Christmas Vespers), although this fragment might also be a private copy of the prayer for personal use.

The prayer reads:

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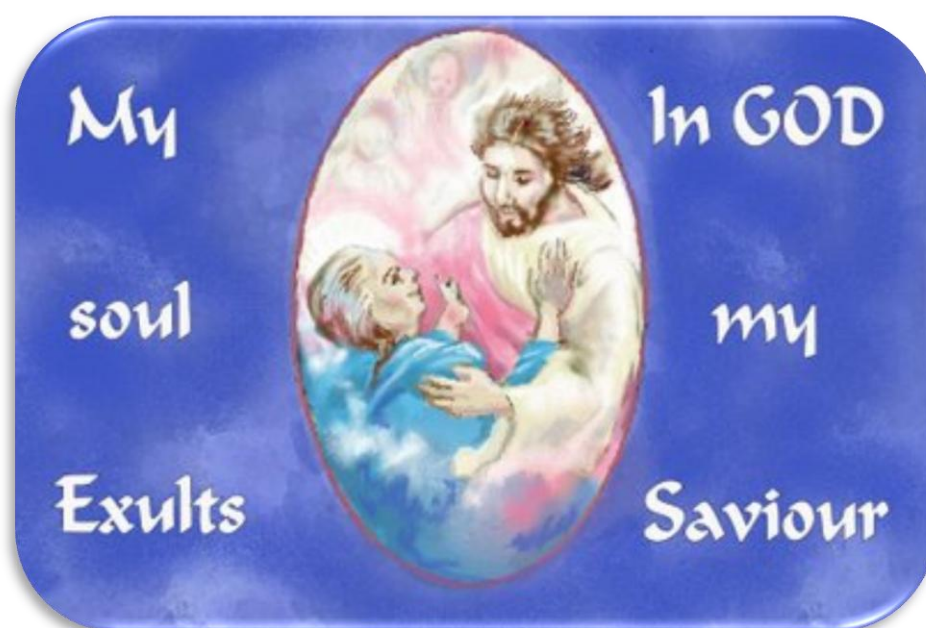


BIRTH OF OUR BLESSED MOTHER MARY (SEPTEMBER 8)



The Church has celebrated Mary's birth since at least the sixth century. A September birth was chosen because the Eastern Church begins its Church year with September. The September 8 date helped determine the date for the feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8 (nine months earlier). Scripture does not give an account of Mary's birth. However, the apocryphal *Protoevangelium of James* fills in the gap. This work has no historical value, but it does reflect the development of Christian piety. According to this account, Anna and Joachim are infertile but pray for a child. They receive the promise of a child that will advance God's plan of salvation for the world. Such a story (like many biblical counterparts) stresses the special presence of God in Mary's life from the beginning.

St. Augustine connects Mary's birth with Jesus' saving work. He tells the earth to rejoice and shine forth in the light of her birth. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed." The opening prayer at Mass speaks of the birth of Mary's Son as the dawn of our salvation and asks for an increase of peace.



POPE TO CHOIRS: 'HELP COMMUNITY SING, DON'T REPLACE ITS VOICE'

Pope Francis invites choirs and singers around the world to promote the Church community's participation and prayer during liturgical celebrations, rather than replacing its voice

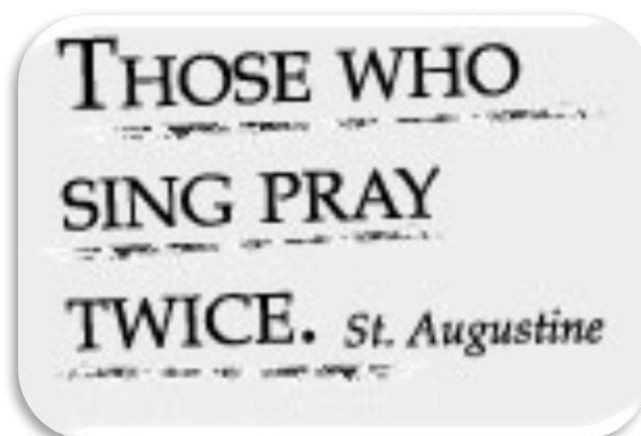
"Your music and song are truly an instrument of evangelization to the extent that you bear witness to the depth of the Word of God, which touches people's hearts, and to the extent that you assist in the celebration of the Sacraments, in particular the Holy Eucharist, allowing us to perceive the beauty of Paradise."

Some 7,000 musicians and singers are participating in the Meeting of Choirs, a three-day event organized by the Pontifical Council for the Promotion of the New Evangelization.

RECENT EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE IN BRAZIL: HOST TURNS INTO BODY AND BLOOD OF JESUS CHRIST

While the Olympics were going on in the Brazilian city of Rio, there was an alleged miracle of the Host turning into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ in another Brazilian city of Tangará da Serra.

This incident which happened in the Sacred Heart of Jesus parish in Tangará da Serra on Sunday, August 14th went viral on social media. One account has it that it happened during the Holy Hour when people were praying in front of Our LORD Jesus Christ while another version of the story has it that it happened during Mass.



The second account said the Priest placed a consecrated host in a chalice with the Precious Blood, drank the Precious Blood, and when he finished noticed something strange: the host had stuck to the side of the chalice, and on it appeared the face of Jesus. Other various stories being passed around are saying the host was or is bleeding, or that it had turned to flesh.

These images have widely circulated and from the images above, this must have happened during the Holy Hour. There is no official Church claim in this as a Eucharistic miracle yet, there must be proper investigation before the Church can authoritatively proclaim this as a Eucharistic miracle.

FILIPINO NEWS**ILONGGA NUN FROM MOLO ON PATH TO SAINTHOOD**

Ilongga nun Maria Beatriz del Rosario Arroyo, known fondly as Madre Sayong or Mother Rosario, is another step closer to sainthood.

Madre Sayong, born in Molo district on Feb. 17, 1884 and died on June 14, 1957, was the founder of the congregation Dominican Sisters of the Most Holy Rosary and a great grandaunt of First Gentleman Mike Arroyo.

Early this month without much fanfare, Pope Francis declared “the heroic virtues of the Servant of God Rosario of the Visitation” nearly 10 years after then Jaro Archbishop Angel Lagdameo issued an edict initiating the diocesan process for the “Cause of the Canonization of the Servant of God Mother Rosario Arroyo de la Visitation.”

With the Pope’s recent move, Madre Sayong is granted the title “Venerable”. The next stage in her “cause” would be beatification, followed ultimately by canonization.

With several miracles attributed to her, this relative by affinity of former president Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo could be the country’s next saint.

The Philippines currently has two saints in the Catholic Church – San Lorenzo Ruiz de Manila and San Pedro Calungsod.

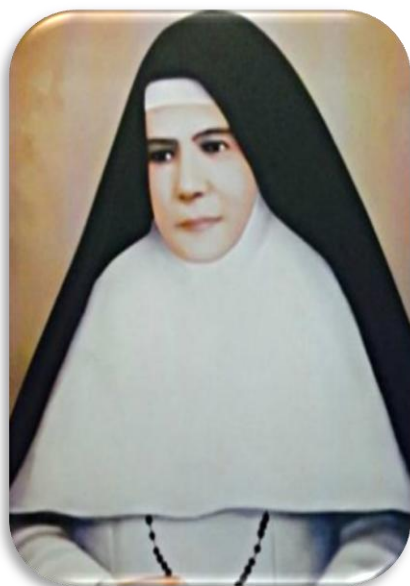
The canonization process for Mother Rosario formally started on Oct. 7, 2009 at the St. Anne Church in Molo where she was baptized.

Mother Rosario was a daughter of wealthy couple Ignacio Arroyo and Doña Maria Pidal but at an early age, she chose the austere life of the convent. She died of heart failure and was buried at the Molo cemetery but in 1975, her body was exhumed to be transferred to a crypt at the congregation’s motherhouse on Avanceña Street, Molo.

When her coffin was opened, Mother Rosario’s body was still intact. After people rushed to touch her, however, it deteriorated.

Mother Rosario had two brothers. Jose Arroyo became a senator representing Iloilo in 1919 while Mariano Arroyo became the governor of Iloilo in 1928.

Senator Arroyo and spouse Jesusa Lacson from Negros Occidental had seven children, one of whom was Ignacio Arroyo (father of former First Gentleman Mike Arroyo).

**MIRACLES**

Testimonies of favors granted upon Mother Rosario’s intercession included that of a third year high school student of the Sacred Heart Academy in Zarraga, Iloilo. She was admitted in a hospital for continually vomiting, fever and weakness.

The girl remembered the prayer for Mother Rosario in times of illness. While gasping and weakening, she prayed and recovered even before she took her medications.

Another documented testimony of cure was that of a woman named Prescilla of Barangay Tabuc Suba, Jaro district whose daughter Roselyn, an overseas Filipino worker in Cyprus, suffered from intracranial tumor.

Roselyn was hospitalized for three days in Cyprus in June 2009 before she was sent home.

On July 20 of that year, she was admitted at the Intensive Care Unit of the Western Visayas Medical Center. Without financial means, she was operated for free and after a while, her family was told to pray to Mother Rosario. They did just that day and night. After a while, Roselyn fully recovered.

The Mother Rosario Arroyo Commission spearheaded the formal opening of the canonization process in 2009.

In his edict, then Jaro Archbishop Lagdameo called on anyone who may have useful information regarding the cause for Mother Rosario’s canonization to bring such documents, materials or information to his attention.

HOLY LIFE

Mother Rosario made her religious profession at the Congregation of the Dominican Sisters of Sta. Catalina of Siena in Manila.

Later, she founded the Congregation of the Dominican Sisters of the Most Holy Rosary in Molo upon the encouragement and financial assistance of her parents.

She also donated her inheritance to the Congregation and lived a life detached from worldly goods.

During her life, she distinguished herself as an ardent devotee of the Eucharist, the Blessed Sacrament and the Virgin Mary.

Then Archbishop Lagdameo said the diocesan process of canonization was being initiated after consultations with the Holy See, bishops and the faithful of the archdiocese, and after having verified the existence of the widespread sanctity enjoyed by Mother Rosario Arroyo in life and even after her death.

As a religious, Mother Arroyo set an example of the observance of the vows, and mirrored the virtues of purity and innocence, deep simplicity, profound humility, and ardent love for the poor, the sick and the needy.

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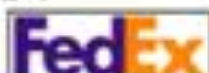
