QUALIFICATION TITLE: Diploma in Specialist Support for Teaching and Learning in Schools

QUALIFICATION LEVEL: Level 3

Introduction

The Level 3 Diploma in Specialist Support for Teaching and Learning in Schools combines knowledge and practice for those specialist support staff roles that directly support teaching and learning. The Level 3 Diploma recognises competence in both generic and specialist aspects of supporting teaching and learning in schools. Typical completion time for this qualification is 12-18 months and it carries 44 credits.

Who should take this qualification?

The qualification is aimed at those support staff roles which directly support teaching and learning, for example teaching assistants or learning support assistants. The Level 3 Diploma provides the essential knowledge needed to work with children and young people in a school setting.

Qualification Content and Assessment Information

Study Location: Work based

How is the qualification delivered? The course material is delivered via blended learning; a mix of assessor visits and work uploaded onto an electronic portfolio. The Assessor will visit the workplace to facilitate observation of practice and professional discussion. Dependent on the payment method, the number of visits may vary.

Assessment and Exams: There are no exams for this qualification. The qualification is an ongoing assessment of learners work plus Observation, Discussion, Expert Witness and Assignments. Learners are allocated an experienced assessor who will have competency in your particular field and will support and guide the learner and ensure that the range of evidence produced fulfils the following criteria; Valid is relevant to the standards for which competence is claimed Authentic is produced by the learner Reliable indicates that the learner can consistently perform at this level Current is sufficiently recent to create confidence that the same skill, understanding or knowledge persist at the time of the claim Sufficient fully meets the requirements of the standards

Units: There are 11 mandatory units which are;

- Support assessment for learning
- Support Children and Young People's Health and Safety
- Support learning activities;
- Understand Child and Young person Development
- Understand how to safeguard the wellbeing of Children and Young people

Optional Units: learners select from 44 optional units that total 44 credits which are;

- Plan and deliver activities under the direction of a teacher
- Provide literacy and Numeracy support
- Support Children's speech, language, and communication
- Support delivery of the 14-19 curriculum
- Support gifted and Talented leaners
- Support Literacy development
- Support numeracy Development
- Support Teaching and Learning in a curriculum area
- Provide bilingual support for teaching and learning
- Support bilingual leaners
- Support Children and Young people with behaviour
- Emotional and Social development needs
- Support disabled and young people and those with special education needs

Entry requirements: There are no formal entry requirements although a good standard of English and Maths is necessary and initial assessments are offered to learners without prior achievement. Learners would need to be working/volunteering for an average of two days per week in the setting in order to meet the assessment requirements
