COURSE TITLE: Emergency first aid at work COURSE LEVEL: 3

DURATION: One day (6 hours)

Introduction

A one day course in First Aid designed to give an introduction to this subject with particular emphasis on children and young people.

This is a lifesaver course giving participants essential life saving emergency techniques. This course covers the needs of the appointed person tailored to your workplace. Suitable for low risk workplaces where a nominated person will deal with emergency incidents.

Learning outcomes

Each day starts with Introductions

The course requires 6 hours of learning and is taught over 1 day with 4 sessions of one and a half hours. Different trainers arrange the days in different ways so that there is no set programme but all the following subject areas will be covered in depth.

- First aid kit
- Action planning
- Treatment of an unconscious casualty
- Resuscitation
- · Choking. CPR.
- Asthma and diabetic emergencies
- Head injuries,
- Seizures, convulsions
- Bleeding. Eye injuries
- Burns, scalds and smoke inhilation
- Sprains, strains and fractures. Spinal injuries
- Poisoning, bites and stings,
- Allergies, anaphylaxis
- Foreign objects
- Shock
- Drowning. Electric shock
- Heat stroke and hypothermia
