COURSE TITLE: Safeguarding Children and Young people COURSE

LEVEL: 3

DURATION: One day

Introduction

This course is designed to provide a basic awareness of child protection including signs and symptoms, likely behaviours, do's and don'ts and recording processes to equip learners with the knowledge to be able to safeguard children and young people. The course also allows learners to look at the wider picture and to understand that protecting children is a proactive activity as well as reactive reporting.

Benefits of Attending

A key responsibility placed on staff is to safeguard children and young people in our care it is therefore of critical importance that all staff can demonstrate an understanding of risks and the impact of previous experiences on children who have been abused
