



FAITH FORMATION

Faith Matt-ers

Faithful Citizenship

Many of you may have heard that Pope Francis has declared a "Jubilee Year of Mercy", which began on December 8 (The Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary) and will continue until November 20, 2016 (The Feast of Christ the King). The notion of jubilee years goes back to the Old Testament, when, according to Jewish law, a jubilee year was celebrated every 50 years. During such years, debts were forgiven, slaves were freed, and land that had been consolidated by the wealthy was redistributed to the poor. This regular practice of jubilee was meant as an act of human mercy, which was to reflect the divine mercy that God had shown to Israel throughout her history. In the year 1300 AD, Pope Boniface VIII declared the first papal jubilee year, when Christians were encouraged to engage in acts of piety and mercy, and to make pilgrimages to various historic churches, especially St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. Ever since 1300, a papal jubilee year has been celebrated every 50 years: these are known as "ordinary" jubilees. Occasionally, a pope will declared an "extraordinary" jubilee year between the ordinary ones. This is what Pope Francis has done for the current Year of Mercy. In the coming months you'll be hearing more about how we can celebrate this jubilee year.

Shifting gears a bit, the year 2016 is an election year, which means that we as citizens of the United States will have the opportunity to vote for who will lead our country for the next term, at the executive level and at the legislative level, at the national level and at the state level. For the next several weeks I will explore an important document issued every four years by the bishops of the United States - "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: A Call to Political Responsibility" (visit http://usccb.org/issues-and-action/faithful-citizenship to view it). This document is meant to help Catholic citizens to discern how their faith can and should enlighten their voting decisions. I realize that I am venturing into what can sometimes be a very volatile and divisive topic, but I simply offer this series as a way of encouraging you to read the bishops' document and carefully reflect on its meaning. Like the bishops themselves, I will stay focused on issues rather than political candidates or parties, and I will attempt to help you to sort through and weigh these various issues.

As Catholics, our decisions about who to vote for are never merely political decisions, but rather are profoundly *moral* ones, grounded in our vision of what a good society should look like. Our vision of the good society is grounded in our understanding of the dignity of the human person, created in the image of God and redeemed in Christ. A good society is one which does all that it can to protect, defend, and promote the full human dignity of *all* of its members, especially those who are most vulnerable and least able to do this for themselves. We believe that this *full* appreciation of the dignity of the human person can only be grasped through faith in God, who has fully revealed himself in the incarnation, life, death, and resurrection of his Son, Jesus Christ. As fully human and fully divine, Jesus Christ reveals to us **both** the deepest mystery of who God is, *and* the deepest mystery of who we are called to be as human persons. However, this is not to say that only those who believe in Jesus will have a good appreciation of human dignity and the common good. As Catholics we can celebrate the common ground that we share with other Christians, with Jews and Muslims, and with the members of all the various world religions that have found their way here to America. We can even build bridges with agnostics and atheists who are committed to human flourishing and the common good.

To begin with, though, if we want to contribute in a vigorous way to public discourse and the political process, as Catholics we must first be clear about our starting point and our basic convictions. We believe that the Church founded by Christ, through its living Tradition and its inspired Scriptures, continues to hand on and faithfully interpret the deepest truth about God and humanity that is revealed in Christ. Jesus formed and commissioned the Church to proclaim to the world, in word and deed, the Good News (Gospel) of salvation. This message and mission of salvation is not just a "spiritual" or "religious" message, but a profoundly *human* one, for through it God seeks to draw our whole human reality into his healing love. Thus, this message will not just touch our "spiritual" lives, but our moral, communal, cultural, political, and economic lives, since to be human is always an embodied and communal act, not just a spiritual and individual act.

As Catholics we also believe that this Good News of Jesus Christ, as handed on through Tradition and Scripture, requires a living and continuing teaching office in order to assure its faithful transmission and interpretation. We'll explore this further next week.

This Christmas Season Contemplate the Lives of the Holy Family

Advent and Christmas are one of my favorite times of the year. Every year I look forward to opening the door to the Adoration Chapel and seeing the nativity set up beneath Our Savior, Jesus, in the Blessed Sacrament. You can certainly feel the warmth of the Holy Family—Jesus, Mary, and Joseph—when you step inside the Chapel after coming in from the bitter cold.

As my eyes gazed upon the nativity statue of Our Blessed Mother, I thought how different matters would have been without her "yes" and total trust and submission to God. Then I prayed, Dear God, may I be more like Mary, obedient and trusting and always say "yes" to Your Will.

And then my eyes drifted toward Joseph. I have always felt that sometimes we forget or ignore his important role in the whole nativity story. Maybe this is because Joseph was such a humble man. But yet, he was given the graces of faith and strength to be able to endure every thing that was put in his path. He was the ultimate protector of his family Then I prayed, Dear God, may I be more like Joseph, humble in my ways, but yet filled with great faith and strength to endure any adversities given to me. Help me to protect my family.

Then I gaze upon the Baby Jesus, who possessed both His Mother's and stepfather's blessed gifts of grace. He was humble, yet strong and faithful just like Joseph. He was also obedient and trusting of His Father's Will just like Mary. Then I prayed, Dear God, may I be more like Jesus, in every way.

My eyes then are lifted up to His Real Presence in the Blessed Sacrament. I then can visually and spiritually see God's plan right before my eyes. Jesus, the Son of God was made flesh as a baby, and as I look upward, He then became our spiritual nourishment in the Eucharist at the Last Supper. The Year of Mercy Pilgrimage Church Open House

On December 12, our Diocese began the Celebration of the Holy Year of Mercy. At the request of the Holy Father, Catholics around the world will be celebrating a special time of recognition of the Great Mercy of God. A Holy Year features special celebrations of pilgrimages with calls for conversion and repentance. In our Diocese, nine Churches have been designated as Pilgrimage sites. Immaculate Conception Church in Elmhurst is the Pilgrimage Church for the Eastern DuPage Deanery. In recognition of the start of this Holy Year, an Open House for all in our Deanery will be held on the Feast of the Epiphany, January 3, from 2:00–4:00 P.M. at Immaculate Conception Church, 132 Arthur St., Elmhurst. Like the Wise Men who went forth to view the Lord, you are invited as pilgrims to come and pray before the Lord. This will be a time for silent prayer as we recall the Great Mercy of God.

It is possible to obtain a plenary indulgence during this Holy Year. An indulgence is the remission in the eyes of God of the temporal punishment due to sins, the guilt of which has been absolved through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The Christian faithful who are rightly disposed and observe the definite, prescribed conditions gain this remission through the effective assistance of the Church. A plenary indulgence frees a person from all of the temporal punishment due to sins and may be gained only once on any one day. Indulgences are only applicable to oneself and to the dead.

How can one obtain a plenary indulgence during the Holy Year of Mercy? By having the intention of acquiring the indulgence – while also having the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin; going to confession (before or after the visit); receiving Holy communion; making a profession of faith; praying for the Holy Father and for the intentions that he bears in his heart for the good of the Church and of the entire world while doing any of the following:

The faithful; by visiting one of the diocesan pilgrimage churches;

The sick and people who are elderly and alone: by receiving Holy Communion or attending Holy Mass and community prayer (even through the various means of communication);

Those who are incarcerated: by visiting the chapel in the prison;

The faithful: by personally performing one or more of the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy.

The faithful by remembering the deceased at Holy Mass and praying that they be freed from every remnant of fault and thus be embraced by God in the blessedness of life eternal.
