St Andrew's Eastoke Southwood Road



Parking—Disabled parking is outside the church door. The car park is flat.

Entry— There are small steps into one entrance, and a ramp into the other.

Books are given out by someone at the door. Please ask for large print or a magnifying sheet.

Wheelchair accessible seating—The space is flexible; we will make sure you have a comfortable place to sit.

Communion is given at ground level. If you want communion brought to you, or if you require a gluten free wafer, please speak to the person who greets you at the door.

Toilets—We have two accessible toilets with baby changing facilities in the hall, which is connected to the church.

Loop—The church is fitted with a loop system.

Breastfeeding—Mums are welcome to feed wherever they want; there is a side room for privacy if required.

Please note, the space is used flexibly and the chairs are not always arranged the same way each week.

St Mary's South Hayling Church Road



Parking—Disabled parking is on the road by the main gate. The path is flat.

Entry—The main church door is accessible. The handle is to your right.

Books are given out by someone at the door. Please ask for large print or a magnifying sheet.

Wheelchair accessible seating—The space is fully flexible; you can sit anywhere.

Communion is given at ground level. Please speak to the person giving out the books if you want communion brought to you, or if you require gluten free wafers or to receive communion in your seat.

Toilets—The nearest toilets are across the road at the Parish Centre. The toilet is wheelchair accessible but the road is busy so ask for assistance to cross if required.

Loop—The church is fitted with a loop system.

Breastfeeding—Mums are welcome to feed; there is a screen for privacy at the back of the church if required.

St Peter's Northney St Peter's Road



Parking—Disabled parking is immediately opposite the church door. The car park and path are flat.

Entry—The church is accessible via the main door or the hall entrance.

Books are given out by someone at the door. Please ask for large print or a magnifying sheet.

Wheelchair accessible seating—We have fixed pews in the church, but there is room for wheelchairs at various places. A welcomer will guide you to the best place.

Communion is given at the altar which is not wheelchair accessible. Please speak to the person giving out the books if you would like communion brought to you, or if you require a gluten free wafer.

Toilets—We have an accessible toilet on site with baby changing facilities.

Loop—The church is fitted with a loop system.

Breastfeeding—Mums are welcome to feed; there is privacy in the hall at the back of the church if required.
