

# Accessible Trails are Best by Bus!

## Explore North Whidbey with public transit.

Whether wanting to explore old growth forests or watch deer frolic in the tall grass, Island Transit can make your experience convenient and easy.

- 1 Fort Casey State Park** This park is the home of both an 1890's Coast Artillery Fort and a 1901 Lighthouse. The bus stops at the base of a steep hill at the park entrance. Enter the park and take the gravel road behind the offices to get close to the gun emplacements. *Served by Route 6 Mon-Fri and Route 1 on Sat.*
- 2 Kettles-Rhododendron Bike Path** Two miles of paved trail with views of Ebey's Prairie and the water and mountains to the west. Enter from S. Main Street in Coupeville. *Served by Route 1 Mon-Sat. or Route 6 Mon-Fri.*
- 3 Rhododendron Park** Located in Coupeville, this park has a paved road through the middle called Rhody Road. Restrooms and picnic shelters are at the far end of the park. *Served by Route 1 SB—exit at Jacobs Road. Take the bike path to the park just to the east. Northbound served by Route 1 or 6; access the park from S. Main Street using the Rhododendron bike path for 1.7 miles.*
- 4 Hastie Lake Beach Park** This is a great place to watch a sunset. A sturdy bench sits just above the beach. Dress for sun and wind. *Served by Route 6 Mon-Fri; bus stops at the paved parking lot.*
- 5 Oak Harbor's Waterfront Trail** This trail hugs the harbor for over a mile with a gravel trail on the west end through Freund Marsh and a paved trail through Windjammer Park. Playgrounds, a story walk, picnic tables, benches, and restrooms can be found along the way. Flintstone Park on the east end is just across Bayshore Drive from Harbor Station, the main bus terminal on North Whidbey. *Served by Routes 1, 3, 411W, 6 or 14; reach Harbor Station and cross the street.*

Our fare free, safe and friendly buses have room for 1-2 wheelchairs or mobility devices, and 2-3 bikes on the bike rack. Buses run Monday-Saturday. For details visit [www.islandtransit.org](http://www.islandtransit.org) or call 360-678-7771 for assistance.
