THE WALKER LEGACY STORY

A Report by Stan Stevenson

The popular video, "The Walker Legacy," had its genesis at a board meeting May 30, 1992. Discussion about a Walker video centered around who, what, when, how, and where. It ended up by Stan Stevenson volunteering to give it a try.

A good video must have a good name. Clint Walker came up with a winner, "The Walker Legacy." A master copy was produced for the August 1993 family reunion.

To accomplish this goal, it was necessary for me to go to the places of beginning. A trip to Peacham, Vermont; Woodbury, Connecticut; Plymouth and Boston, Massachusetts was accomplished.

Harold Wood of Scotia, New York, met me in Montpelier, Vermont, and gave great service in providing transportation and guidance. He is a Walker. His wife, Jean, accompanied us. This effort was successful in securing three hours of quality video footage.

We met Reverend Marsden, the minister in the very church in Woodbury, Connecticut, where Zechariah Walker was the founder in 1670. Zechariah Walker was the son of Robert Walker, who was the Walker immigrant ancestor to Boston in 1630.

In Plymouth, we were able to photograph the Mayflower II, and visit with Mayflower Society people, who were delighted with our video project. They were very helpful. A copy of the "Ancestry and Descendants of John Walker" was presented for their library.

It was in Plymouth that we learned that our thirteen-year-old pilgrim, Mary Chilton, was not buried in Plymouth, but in Boston. She moved to Boston with her husband and ten children about 1655. One of my objectives was to photograph her gravesite. It was Mary Chilton who, it is believed and seems very probable, wanted to be the first woman to go ashore. Tradition justifies the claim.

I set off to Boston in search of Mary's gravesite and to get cvideo footage of the place. I found the grave. She is entombed with her husband, John Winslow, the brother of Edward Winslow, the governor of the Plymouth Plantation according to early history.

The tomb was found in the King's Chapel Burial Ground. The tomb bears the Winslow Coat of Arms in black slate, about two feet in diameter. I placed flowers on the tomb site in the name of her descendants. It was a tender moment for me.

It was most interesting that Robert Walker was one of twenty-nine dissenters, who withdrew from the First Church of Boston and organized the Third Church, also known as the Old South Church. That withdrawal resulted in much bitterness. John Alden, a Walker progenitor, was one of the twenty-nine dissenters. His signature is just below Robert Walker's on the dissent document.

Interesting too, is that Mary Chilton Winslow and her husband, John, were both members of the Old South Church at the same time with Robert Walker. So, our Grandmother Mary and Grandfather Robert were going to that church together over 300 years ago.

The genealogical line from Robert Walker and Mary Chilton Winslow meet again at the marriage of John Walker and Lydia Holmes in 1819, about 200 years later.

I made a second trip to Plymouth and Boston December 1992 and January 1993, to do additional research. This trip was very beneficial in developing more information verifying dates, times and places.

It was on this second journey that I presented a copy of the "Ancestry and Descendants of John Walker" to the Old South Church at Copley Square, their location since moving the congregation in the early 1700's.

The historic building, known as the Old South Meeting House, at Washington and Milk streets, is just that, a meeting house where public meetings are held. It is also a museum.

The death of Sarah Walker, Robert's wife, was confirmed. Her last words were: "God bless all my posterity." This means you, a Walker or extended family. Both trips were worth the effort and expense.

I hope you have and enjoy a copy of that visual history, a video of "THE WALKER LEGACY."

More about the Video "The Walker Legacy"

Stan Stevenson also made more footage telling about the first family of John Walker. The following are a few items of interest from the video:

There is a copy of of the First Edition of the Book of Mormon which now belongs to a Walker relative, the cane which once belonged to Hyrum Smith; the story of mummies, which brought the papyrus known as the Pearl of Great Price to the Prophet Joseph Smith, kept in a closet where Lorin Walker's children played.

The video also relates about a few incidents about Pres. Heber C. Kimball and Lucy Walker and their children.

There is a story about John Walker and his family being converted to the L.D.S. Church, and their experience at the Haun's Mill in Missouri. The Walker family was involved with the Prophet Joseph Smith. John Walker's oldest son William Holmes Walker was also mentioned and about his part in the Mormon Battalion and his missionary experience in South Africa.

The rough draft of the video "The Walker Legacy" was shown at the Walker reunion in 1993 at the Rock Creek Girl's Camp near Twin Falls, Idaho. It was acclaimed and well received by those present at the same. Many orders for copies were placed in advance.

Kent Norton, the Weatherman on Channel 5, is the narrator and tells many things about the Walker Family. He is our cousin indeed.
