# Dates for January

### **December Weather**

December has been unusually mild, overcast, but not overly wet. There have been a few mornings with ground frosts, but the thermometer only went down to 0.9 degrees.

The warmest day was the 19<sup>th</sup> at 12.5 deg C, and the lowest recorded temperature was 0.9 deg C on 5th. Average temp for the month being 6.4 deg C.

We had 105 mm of rain with the wettest day being the 2<sup>nd</sup> with 12.6 mm. There were 6 days where no rain was recorded.

Sunshine will always be low at this time of year, with the sun hardly getting above the horizon during the day. Total recorded was 166.5 w/m<sup>2</sup>, and average of 5.4 w/m<sup>2</sup> and a high of 9.2 on 18th.

The average wind speed was 8.2 mph, the windiest day being the 19th with an average speed of 18.9 mph. A gust of 59.9 mph was recorded on the 17<sup>th</sup>.

Air pressure reached a high of 1021 mB on 26th, and low of 969 on 7th, the average was 999 mB.

# 2018 Weather Summary

The highest temperature recorded was 25.3 degrees in July, and the lowest -4.2 in Feb. Average temperature for the whole year was 9.0 degrees.

Rainfall total was 1126 mm, the wettest day in Oct with 39.6 mm. There were 137 days where no rain was recorded.

The sun produced a total 23,238 watts/m<sup>2</sup>, with the sunniest month being June. The sunniest day produced 246 w/m<sup>2</sup> in June, and the daily average was 63 w/m<sup>2</sup>.

The strongest winds were in March, with an average monthly speed of 10.5 mph, a high daily average of 30.6, and the highest gust of 65.2 mph.

Highest air pressure was 1030 mB in Feb, and low of 969 mB in Dec. The average being 1002 mB.
