We are keen to showcase local crafts, so if you have anything you would like us to sell on your behalf please get in touch.



#### **Raft Race Rules**

1. Participation is at own risk.


- 2. Every raft must have at least one over 18 on board.
  - 3. Lifejackets should be worn by all participants.
- 4. Rafts MUST be in the water for the race to start at 12 noon.
- 5. A safety boat will be on standby to assist in any incidents.
  - 6. Rafts should be home-made.
  - 7. Rafts should be powered purely by people-power.
- 8. Raft teams should comprise of 4 people. 9. Judges decisions are final! 10. Have fun & keep safe!

#### Livestock Awareness

Dog walkers are reminded that their pooches should be kept under control, preferably on a lead, whilst walking through fields of livestock. This is for their own welfare, as well as that of their dogs and the animals in the fields.

Those of you who have contact with visitors, as guests or residents, are asked to remind any dog owners, and walkers in general, to be vigilant of the countryside code, particularly with regard to leaving gates as they are found, taking litter home and keeping dogs under control.
