June Weather

While taking a walk out over the croft with the dogs in the mornings, it's lovely to see wild flowers and insects appearing through the summer. Stonecrop is just coming into flower, small white flowers clinging to the rock. Birds foot trefoil has small bright yellow flowers turning orange and red (it's named after the shape of the seed pods). Common blue, Scotch Argus butterflies and Magpie and Burnet moths are also frequently seen on the wing, especially in this warm and dry weather. But the most obvious factor of this long dry spell is the grass dying back off the rock. There are large patches of shallow soil, that can't retain moisture, and the grass dies back. It will recover when it rains next.

The warmest day of the month (and year) was yesterday, 30th when it reached 25.1 degrees. The coldest temp was 7.7 deg C on 20th, and the average was 13.6 deg C. We have only had 33.6 mm of rain, falling in the middle of the month, and with 9 mm on 20th. There have been 19 days without rain. Average wind speed for the month was 3.6 mph, with an average of 11.3 mph on 14th. A gust of 40 mph was also recorded. The barometer reached a high of 1025 mB on 21st, with a low of 971 mB on 14th. The average was 1011 mB.
