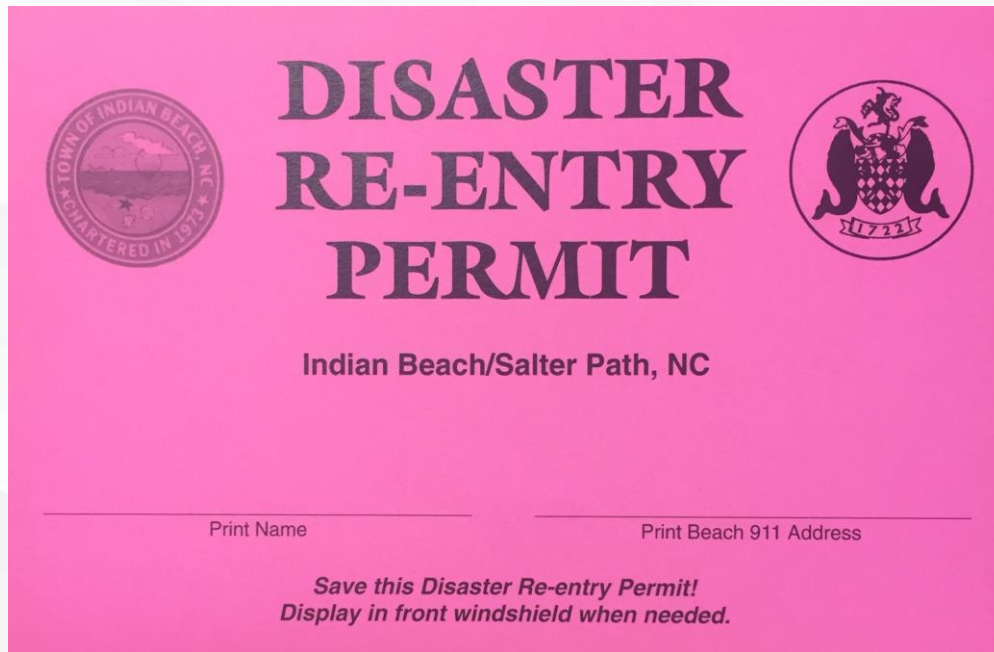

# RE-ENTRY PERMITS



- May be picked up at the Indian Beach Town Hall at 1400 Salter Path Road from 9-5 Monday – Friday.
- Must bring proof of ownership as well as your license.
- 1<sup>st</sup> re-entry permit is free of charge.
- Replacement or additional permits cost \$25.00 each with a maximum of 3 issued to the residence.
- Please note, no permits will be issued once a state of emergency is declared.

# ITEMS TO HAVE READY



- Insurance information
- Cash
- Cell phone charger for vehicle
- Flashlights with spare batteries
- Tarps
- First aid kit
- Weather radio
- Water & food for 5 days
  - 1 gallon per person, per day of water
  - Easily prepared meals

# FIRE DEPARTMENT FUNCTIONS



- Respond to incidents up to 50 mph sustained winds.
- Door-to-door head count pre-storm.
- Co-ordinate resources for Indian Beach and Salter Path through Emergency Management.
- Investigate downed powerlines and begin coordination efforts with Carteret Craven Electric.
- Co-ordinate de-watering operations throughout Indian Beach and Salter Path.
- Door-to-door survey post-storm based off the head count pre-storm.

# POLICE DEPARTMENT FUNCTIONS

- Enforce state and local laws before during and after the storm.
- If possible, to record before and after storm video for residents to view on-line instead of using 911 or police phone lines for non-emergent calls.
- Assist in placing barricades up at areas that are not safe for public to visit
- Assist in a public safety role with clean up efforts to help make Indian Beach safe again.



# PUBLIC WORKS FUNCTIONS



- Public Works will co-ordinate the cleanup of debris.
- Debris drop off site will be posted on social media and websites as they come available.
- In order to drop off debris, you must bring your re-entry pass to show that the debris came from Indian Beach or Salter Path.
- Assist with town cleanup and beach cleanup.



# HAZARDS POST-STORM



- Down power lines
- Standing water
- Trees down or hanging
- Drinking water
- Traffic lights not working
- Nails in the road
- Wildlife
  - Insects
  - Snakes
  - Lost pets
