Committee Reports:

Schoolhouse: Wilma Bentley reported that from June 2016 to September 4, 2016 the heritage centre had 319 visitors.

Fall Fair: Dona Crawford reported that the Historical Society's table at the fall fair was a success. We sold 7 calendars, 11 newspapers and collected \$40 in donations. The "Guess the Artifact" display attracted a lot of people to our table.

General Business:

1. *Sunday Schedule for the Fall:* Wilma Bentley will continue to keep the schoolhouse open every Sunday. Displays and write ups have been prepared for visitors. A short film will be presented. We will be serving tea and scones. An email will be sent to Township or Ryerson, Village of Burk's Falls, Township of Armour, the Library & our Community Facebook Page Administrator requesting that the event be shared on their website and/or Facebook page. Member volunteers for the event include Trina Chatelain and Dona Crawford.
4. *Pumpkin Carving Event:* Discussion was held by Members and decisions were made as follows for the event: It will be held on Saturday, October 15, 2016 from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. Trina Chatelain will create a poster advertising our Halloween Party. Copies could be distributed to students of MA Wittick Junior Public School. We will promote the event as a costume party with crafts and games for the children. A treat bag will be handed out to children at the end. The cost for admittance will be \$5.00 per family. Charlene will purchase craft items for the spider web paper plates and glow in the dark eye tubes.

Decorations, candy treats, apples and refreshments will be required.

Canada 150 Celebration: Charlene Watt reported that Diane Brandt is the Historical Society's Representative and happily accepted the invitation to coordinate the planning of the 2017 events with the Township of Ryerson and Township of Armour. Thank you, Diane! Charlene Watt is the Canada 150 Committee member representing the Township of Armour.

Diane reported that she has been in contact with locals regarding a trapping display and will also contact Hubbert's Maple Syrup in Sundridge for a maple syrup display. She will contact the Mulligan's for a logging demonstration.

Nieves has four (4) videos reserved by the Library to loan for the Ryerson Celebration Day on local historical steamships.

An application for funding has been submitted by Leanne Fetterley from the Township of Ryerson, once a response is received from the government, additional information will be provided in order for definite event plans to be initiated.

The activities will kick-off with Ryerson's "Market and Antique Day" and "Schoolhouse Homecoming" on June 24th where people of all ages will learn about the history of logging, steamships, and settlement in our community.

Members of the Burk's Falls & District Historical Society will host a "homecoming" at the Wiseman Corners Schoolhouse Museum (b. 1893) by inviting descendants of the original Ryerson settlers to gather there and share their family stories. The Museum site will also be activated to host an interactive archival demonstration and displays about the history of logging and steamships. A new plaque to commemorate the 150th celebration will join the existing tribute to the Centennial celebration held at the School House in 1967. Only a short walk away, there will be a Market Sale featuring antiques, arts & crafts, fresh produce, and a complimentary barbeque at the Ryerson Municipal property. To add to the festive atmosphere, local musical artist Glenn Reid will perform music from his album Heritage River – a collection of songs inspired by the Magnetawan River.

On July 1, 2017 the festival will bring a new focus to Canada Day festivities in the Village of Burk's Falls. Festival-goers will have the chance to participate in traditions of the past. Walk the paths along the Magnetawan River, ride in a horse-drawn wagon, watch a horse-pull, or...zoom down the streets of Burk's Falls in a soapbox built like a steamship!

The day will begin with a guided tour of the Heritage River Walk. This is a 1.4 km scenic walking trail along the Magnetawan River that incorporates the sites of many historic activities including the tannery, sash and door factory, logging, the railway, and riverboats.

Following this, enjoy a horse-drawn wagon ride or watch a horse pull at the Fairgrounds to experience the original "horse-power" used to work our farms and early industries. Families won't want to miss the "Steamship" soapbox derby with a free barbeque and live entertainment at Stan Darling Village Park. The festivities conclude in the evening with the "Log Drivers Waltz" Street Dance – an outdoor gathering inspired by the dance-like movements performed by loggers as they walked on logs floating down the river. The finale for this very special July 1st will be a spectacular fireworks display.

The festival will culminate with activities in Armour Township on July 8th. The Historical Society hosts "Heritage Day" at the Watt Century Farmhouse featuring a special museum exhibit about Ontario's agricultural past. Costumed

interpreters will bring farming history to life and families will be engaged with a petting farm, horse-drawn wagon rides, a bouncy barn and heritage games.

Traditional industries will be profiled such as trapping and Maple Syrup and Ontario Power Generation will provide information about the historical dam. We will acknowledge the history of the Homestead Act and encourage a greener future by distributing pine saplings to be planted.

The final activity of the Celebrating Saw and Steam series is the "Confederation" Dance hosted by the Katrine Community Centre. The theme of early farming and logging will bridge the past and the present with guests wearing their best lumber jackets, and kicking up their heels to square dance tunes by local folk and country musicians.

The activities presented throughout the Saw and Steam celebration are hosted by Burk's Falls, Armour, Ryerson, and the Burk's Fall & District Historical Society. These four organizations will not be requesting funds for individual events, but have all partnered together to develop and execute this new festival. All partner organizations will provide staff to organize and host the events and will work together to recruit volunteers. The entire festival and all of the activities will be promoted through a comprehensive marketing plan that includes print ads, posters, radio ads, a social media campaign, and special branded items.

5. *Postcards:* Trina Chatelain advised that some visitors to the Watt Farm House have inquired about a postcard for the heritage site. Diane Brandt offered to obtain a quote on the item.
6. *Wood Cook Stove:* Trina Chatelain reported that the Algonquin Park Visitor Centre was offered a wood cook stove donation but refused the offer. Trina offered the item to the Historical Society. The Watt Farm House kitchen does not have a stove on display. The donor would like a tax receipt. Trina was directed by Members to research the donation offer of a wood cook stove to determine suitability and the history of the appliance.
7. *Watt Farm House Sewing Room:* It was decided by Members that after the Pumpkin Carving Event, the sewing room display will be taken down, the wallpaper removed and the wall trim stripped. Diane Brandt didn't recommend painting the upstairs room in the fall. Depending on the weather, heaters may be required. Diane indicated that there is not much heat upstairs in the fall, especially in the afternoon.

The building will need to be vacated for at about four (4) hours.

It is an Adam Hall cast iron stove with oven. The markings on it are "#323 Portable Prairie stove - made in Peterborough" circa 1910. It has rings for transporting as this type of stove was used in camps and was transported as needed. It contains a removable water tank which was an option at time of purchase. I may be wrong but I believe it's made of copper. The dimensions including the tank are:

- 25" deep
- 53" wide. (40" if the tank is removed)
- 34" high

The water tank measures 22" deep x 13" wide

The stove is in our log cabin that was built in 1882. The stove was acquired in 1929.
