5. Canopy Tent:

Diane Brandt has received permission from the Village of Burk's Falls to borrow the canopy tent for Heritage Day. Jarv Osborne will co-ordinate setting up the tent and Charlene Watt will assist Jarv in providing volunteers.

6. Report on Plaques and Mail Bag:

Diane Brandt reported to Members that she will be reviewing the title plates for the past dedicated members plaque this week. Wording for the mail bag display has been approved and the artifact preservation project is progressing well.

New Business:

1. Logo for 25th Anniversary:

Brad Crozier created five different 25th Anniversary Logos for Members to review. The samples were circulated to Members and a selection was made. The logo will be used on the website, social media, and our letterhead for 2019.

2. Quote for Lawn Bag Signs:
