PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Parish Council Meeting on 14th March 2008 was attended by Cllrs D Weston (Chairman) (878487), D Wooles (Vice Chairman) (878469), Mrs P Bean (878392), Mrs J Calvert (878533), B Parkinson (878373), N Anfield (878738) and I Read (878470). Clerk BC Taylor (878060).

Condition of post and railings around the Village Green: A quotation for the replacement of eight posts around the Village Green was accepted and the work will go ahead shortly.

Relocation of Mono-pole: Latest Position: The Police called a meeting recently to inform the Village of the impending work to be carried out by Orange to connect the Mono-pole and to assist them in planning and carrying out their protest in a way within the law.

The Protest Group will liase with Parish Councillors and the Police in planning their protest. It has been suggested that a sub-group is formed with representatives from these three factions to orchestrate procedures.

Orange has written to the Police stating their willingness to form a Working Group to investigate the physical impact of the pole once it is installed.

Tree in the Square: The old tree will be felled shortly and a new tree planted immediately. Advice will be sought from two Residents as to the type of replacement tree required.

New tree in Castle entrance: A new tree has been planted and a plaque installed in dedication to Robert Wood. A ceremony of dedication took place on Saturday, 15th March at 9:30am.

Identification of Trees in the Village: All trees have now been tagged and a map showing their location in the Village is being prepared.

Street signs at Stonelands Close, Calverts Garth and Castleside: Replacement signs will be installed by the end of March.

Village of the Year Competition: The sub-committee of Cllrs Mrs Bean, Mrs Calvert and Mr Parkinson will be meeting shortly to complete the Application and progress matters.

Traffic matrix: The Parish Council has applied to NYCC to include Sheriff Hutton in the Traffic Matrix Pilot Scheme. The application will be considered after the pilots at Gate Helmsley and Wilton have started.

Bus stop at Scotchman Lane: A site meeting between NYCC and Carillion will be arranged to discuss the need to provide hard-standing at this bus stop to avoid passengers having to stand, when the surface is too muddy, in the slip-road to the A64.

Parking outside Village Store: A site visit is planned by NYCC with two Parish Councillors in attendance to look into the matter of introducing limited period parking outside the Store.

Handrails in the Village: NYCC have apologised that they were unable to erect two sets of handrails requested in the Village before the wintry weather set in. They now promise to complete the work by the end of April.

Access ways and footpaths around the Village: NYCC are trying to find the funding necessary to repair paths around the Castle which have already been promised twelve months ago.

Potholes in the access way leading to the property on the south side of Stile House on the Village Green are to be repaired by the builder of the property.

Connection of electricity supply to new property by Stile House: Northern Electricity has already laid these cables and they are embarrassed that they did not follow the correct procedure and ask permission. They will instigate a Wayleave Payment.

CE Electric are happy to attend the Parish Council May meeting to give a presentation about their plans to relay cable in the area for both low and high power supplies.

Planting of additional daffodil bulbs: The Parish Council has agreed to buy more bulbs and to seek the help of volunteers in the Village to plant them at the correct time in the season.

- 07/00555/FUL: Honeybourne Developments: Permission to carry out development at land south of Stile House, The Green, Sheriff Hutton granted by Ryedale DC.
- 08/00029/FUL: Mr IP Drury and Mrs C Shipley: Permission to carry out development at Minster View Barn, 2 Carr Farm, Ashbank Lane, High Stittenham YO60 7TW granted by Ryedale DC.
- NY/2008/0046/FUL: Repositioning of entrance door and screen, and creation of timber and polycarbonate entrance canopy at Sheriff Hutton Primary School, West End, Sheriff Hutton. Councillors supported the application in its present form.

Bus service: Stephensons are taking over the bus service on 28th April.

Extra funding in primary education: It was noted that NYCC have received £12m extra funding to invest in primary education. It was agreed that it would be a good time to approach them to request an upgrade to the temporary accommodation at the Primary School.

Annual Parishioners' Meeting: This will be held on Friday, 11th April 2008 at 7:00pm in the Village Hall. The normal Parish Council Meeting will follow straight after.
