

Parish Council News

The Parish Council Meeting on 13th June 2008 was attended by Cllrs D Wooles (Vice Chairman acting as Chairman), Mrs P Bean, Mrs J Calvert, B Parkinson and N Anfield. Clerk Mr B C Taylor (878060). Apologies received from Cllrs D Weston (Chairman) and I Read.

Posts and Rails around Village Green

Some posts require replacement around the Village Green. A quotation has been obtained for their replacement. Work has started on the staining of posts and painting of rails around the green and it is envisaged it will take about a month to complete. The task is being carried out by a student under the supervision of a resident.

Relocation of Mono-Pole from Dasket Hill

A letter is to be sent to Ofcom requesting the testing for emissions from the Mono-Pole to ensure they comply with international guidelines.

Accounts 2007/8

Accounts were presented to the Parish Council and approved for submission to the External Auditors. A Notice is to be posted on the Parish Notice Board informing residents of their rights to inspect and query accounts.

Village of the Year Competition

The application has progressed to the next round and will involve an inspection on 30th June 2008. Residents will be involved to speak on various aspects of village life and there will be particular emphasis placed on different age groups. Given the fact that the inspectors have limited time there will be static displays which they will be able to walk around and look at. The Vice Chairman will give a short address on the Parish Plan and future intentions and the inspectors will then return from further deliberation and a report.

Hand Rails in Calverts Garth

Hand Rails have now been installed after a protracted wait.

Trimming of Growth in Ginnel next to Primary School

The ginnel has now been tidied up and made safer. NYCC are now to resurface during the school summer holidays.

Grass Cutting Contract

Final details have now been agreed with contractors with regard to the areas to be cut. The next cut will be during the week commencing Monday 16th June 2008 and it hoped that the July cut will be undertaken immediately before the inspection for the Village of the Year Competition.

Planning Applications

Application No 08/00074/FUL: Erection of two storey extension to front of existing two storey extension (retrospective application) at 21 Old Mill View, Sheriff Hutton: dated 20/5/08. Approval granted by Ryedale DC.

Application 08/00532/FUL: Ms Linda Harris: Erection of a conservatory at The Oaks, High Stittenham, York YO60 7TL. Parish Councillors agreed to support the application in its present form.

Application 08/00515/FUL: Mr J Cleather. Erection of a 4-bedroom detached dwelling with attached single garage at land adjacent to Halfway House, Main Street, Sheriff Hutton. Parish Councillors agreed to support this application in its present form providing the proposed works do not extend beyond the existing Development Line.

A special meeting was held on Tuesday 3rd June to discuss the following Planning Applications.

08/00376/FUL: Mr John Dickson: Conversion of detached garage/store to two-bedroom self-contained residential annexe (revised details to refusal 07/00050/FUL dated 24/4/07) at 1 Woodend Cottages, Ashbank Lane, High Stittenham, York, North Yorkshire YO60 7TW. Councillors felt that the concerns they expressed when rejecting the original application had not been dealt with and therefore rejected this application.

08/00436/FUL: Mr Ian Overfield: Change of use of part of workshop to form additional office space at Oak Tree House, 10 Alan Farnaby Way, Sheriff Hutton, York, North Yorkshire YO60 6PG. Councillors agreed to support this application in its present form.

Traffic Regulations around Primary School

NYCC have confirmed that a speed restriction of 20 mph is to be installed around the perimeter of the Primary School from West End Lane into Castle View. A report giving dates for the installation will be supplied as soon as they are to hand.

"16 Circular Walks ...

... in the Sheriff Hutton area" by Alan Farnaby (a new edition is available at 2.50 from the Post Office)

This is a variation on Walk No 8 and follows part of the Ebor Way (many of the serious young walkers through the village are earning Duke of Edinburgh awards). A mix of stone roads and muddy fields, leading to Primrose Farm (many of the newer farms have attractive names eg. Golden Flatts and Cape of Good Hope; older ones – Foulrice and Mill Hill are more prosaic).

From the top of the hill, look southwards to York Minster and the Sugar Beet factory; on a very good day you can see Eggborough and Drax power stations, on a vvg day power stations between Goole and Gainsborough spew their steam.

Most of the land between York and this ridge was in the Forest of Galtres, stretching from Stockton on the Forest and Strensall Common to Easingwold (New Park). It was a greater crime to kill a boar than to kill a man when the forest was in Royal hands. Richard III adopted the boar as his badge from York (Ebor). Most of the villages on the Sheriff Hutton ridge end in –ton (Farlington, Marton etc). Those to the north and not in the forest were Viking settlements, hence WhenBY, SkewsBY, BrandsBY etc.

This must have been an amazing place to see the bombers of WWII from local airfields including East Moors right in front of us, circling around York before heading off for the continent. Nowadays, especially on Thursdays – training days for the SAS – watch out for the helicoptered-delivered troops call in the fast jets as they attack Barton-le-Street (what have they done?).

The walk back is via Mowthorpe Hill Farm, part of the Castle Howard Estate, and has indications of training for three day events. Commission Beck is the 19th Century government-inspired drain to take water away from the Carrs to Bulmer Beck. The racing gallops remind us that Little Snugfit was trained here for the Grand National. The many rounded pebbles or 'cobbles' are left from the times when this land was one vast lake or sea; many of them used in local villages as paving material.
