Parish Council News

The Parish Council Meeting on 8th February 2008 was attended by Cllrs D Weston (Chairman), D Wooles (Vice Chairman), Mrs P Bean, Mrs J Calvert, B Parkinson, N Anfield and I Read. Clerk BC Taylor. No apologies received.

The Chairman welcomed the County Councillor Mrs Clare Wood; Representative for Hovingham and Sheriff Hutton Area.

Extension of Speed Limit:

C. Cllr Mrs Wood confirmed that the extension of the speed limit in the Village had been confirmed as follows. A new 40mph limit to extend from the end of the existing 30mph limit on the Strensall Road up to the Industrial Estate and up to the 30 mph limit on the West Lilling road. Advertising procedures are now in place and if no objections are raised in 28 days then, the Police already having agreed to the proposals in principle, the plans will be implemented.

Handrails in the Village:

C. Cllr Mrs Wood reported that the handrails are scheduled to be installed by the end of March 2008.

Access ways and Footpaths:

A site visit is planned for the head of NYCC Highways to walk the Village paths with two Parish Councillors in order to pin-point areas requiring maintenance.

Traffic Incident outside the Primary School:

In a recent incident outside the Primary School a child was injured by a motor car. The problem has been identified as occurring due to the volume of cars parked in the area rather than a speeding issue. The Governors of the School are in negotiation with NYCC Highways for a site visit and discussion with a view to rectifying the problem. Parish Councillors agreed to write to the Head of the NYCC Highways Department add their comments to the matter.

Condition of Posts and Railings around the Village Green:

A preliminary examination has revealed that 8 posts require replacement and a quotation for the work will be sought.

Tree in the Square:

It was agreed that the tree is a hazard as it creates blind spots. The preferred solution is to remove it and replace it immediately with another tree. A quotation for the felling of the tree will be sought and the Chairman will investigate the best type of replacement for the position.

Identification of Trees in the Village:

So far 60 trees have been tagged.

Street Signs at Stonelands Close, Calverts Garth and Castleside:

The poor condition of these signs has been reported to Ryedale DC. It is proposed to request support from the District Councillor, Eric Hope.

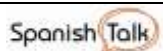
