Parish Council News

The Parish Council Meeting held on 11th April 2008 was attended by Cllrs D Wooles (Vice Chairman), Mrs P Bean, I Read, B Parkinson, N Anfield

Apologies received from Cllrs D Weston (Chairman), Mrs J Calvert, and B Taylor (Clerk) 878060 District Councillor E Hope attended and one member of the public was present.

Cllr Wooles Chaired the meeting and Cllr Mrs P Bean took the minutes

Mono-pole - The installation work was completed during week ending 4th April although it is not known whether the mast has been turned on. Offcom are to be contacted to carry out tests regarding emissions and report back to the Parish Council.

Tree in the Square – The existing tree is to be removed and replaced with a Thuja Piccata Snargd, which is also an evergreen tree. As this will be too small to carry the weight of the Christmas Tree Lights an alternative way of hanging the lights is to be looked into.

Handrails in Calvert's Garth and the East End - These should be installed by the end of April.

Daffodils – A survey has been carried out and areas identified where more daffodils need to be planted in the Autumn. It is hoped to involve families in the planting – Anyone interested should contact Nigel Anfield.

Grass Cutting - As the previous contractors did not wish to continue this year ISS have been awarded the contract. As this is a new contractor there may be areas which are missed and Parishioners are asked to contact The Clerk or any of the Councillors with details. Areas where the daffodils grow will not be cut until they have died back.

Street Signs – New signs have been erected on Stonelands Close, Castle View and Calverts Garth

Village Hall AGM

Seventeen people attended the AGM of the Village Hall on April 8th. The Chairman (Jim Day) was able to report that 2007 had been another successful year for the hall. Bookings remain buoyant and the Operations Group have continued to maintain the hall to a high standard. When the Main Hall floor was cleaned and resealed the contractors commented upon the almost 'as new' condition – this type of floor normally has a 20 year life. This was rewarding news and proof that the policy of preventative maintenance is very effective. The Friends of the Village Hall have continued their good work in holding a range of events to appeal to a cross-section of the community and, in the process, raised money for future projects. The Play Area is in good order and its popularity remains undiminished. The Health & Safety Group ensure compliance with the law and were complimented by North Yorkshire Fire Service on our records and procedures.

The current levels of the financial reserves will ensure that foreseeable repair and renewal costs can be met but major extensions or enhancements would require fundraising and grants. Spiralling costs – especially of heating oil, waste disposal and insurance – are placing pressure on day-to-day running costs (the price of a tank full of oil has risen over 50% in the last year to £1,000 and we use between two and three tanks full each year) but at the moment running costs are being met out of hiring fees, as is required by the constitution.

It is a pleasure to have been able to welcome new people to the Operations Group and Friends – they bring not just new faces but new ideas as well – and we would be pleased to see more people getting involved in running this vital community facility. The work is not onerous and the meetings tend to be social occasions in themselves.

"16 Circular Walks

in the Sheriff Hutton area", by Alan Farnaby
(a new edition is available at £2.50 from the Post Office)

It is about 25 years ago since I typeset (on my BBC Acorn computer!) and printed the first 50 copies of Alan's walks (for the New Village Hall Funds, I believe). I have recently walked the old paths again using the new edition. I don't intend to repeat the walks in this series; rather to reflect some thoughts as I have gone round and noted the highlights.

Walk No 16 High Stittenham – most of these walks follow paths from hamlets and farms which people have used for more than 900 years to reach Sheriff Hutton Parish Church (later to reach school).

The path from Sheriff Hutton crosses the Carrs or Ings, wet flat lands over which the sandstone used for the building of Sheriff Hutton Castle in 1400 (and the church aisles) was brought from quarries at Mowthorpe, near Terrington, using sleds or barges. When I walked across just after Easter it was "claggy" – the Carrs were drained in the C18th by Government Law to provide pasture for Sheriff Hutton's small farms.

High Stittenham was a Norman manor owned by the Gower family, later ennobled as the Dukes of Sutherland (now Leveson-Guer). There is a chantry chapel at St Helen's with a stained glass window of the Gowers in the SW corner. The last wolf hunted in England was killed in Stittenham Woods in the C16th by the Sir Thomas Gower, High Sheriff of Yorkshire. Stittenham is now much gentrified, with fine houses converted from barns.

The return track approaching SH passes the site of an earlier water-mill. Rigg and furrow is an ancient and efficient way of draining land and starting off an early crop, sheltered in the furrow.

A Leeds based arts organisation, Theatre Under Fire (T.U.F) Productions is set to perform their latest dance theatre show 'The Twilight Rainbow' at **Sheriff Hutton Village on the 24th May 2008**. The show will start at **7.30pm**.

The performance is a celebratory explosion of HOME! It's an antidote to the pain of separation, a pulsing, laughing, bittersweet tour of memories shared by the inimitable T.U.F cast, a multi-skilled crew of Zimbabwean refugees and asylum seekers now living in Britain. They came with nothing but their culture in their blood.

Like a tour guide, the cast takes the audiences through an African scenario, in the rural villages where adults are working in the fields, young girls fetching firewood and water while boys are herding livestock and working in industrial sites in towns, farming and mining areas. Music and Dance always play an important role to spice up life in Africa and most importantly help people to drown their sorrows.

The show includes a live soundtrack of shakers, xylophone, whistles, African Djembe drums and cow bells, accompanied by musicians singing melodies.
Tickets for the events are priced at £8 and £6.

Established by professional artists who found themselves under-fire in Zimbabwe, they fled from political turmoil and constant threats of persecution to seek asylum in Britain. Theatre-Under-Fire aims to tackle social matters and bring to the forefront issues that concern vulnerable people, such as asylum seekers etc
