Walk Round Village on 6th July 2009:

Councillors carried out their walk as planned and identified the following matters requiring attention:

- The street light (blue 17) opposite Bramble Cottage, Main Street is out
- Both notice boards in Church End and East End are overgrown with foliage and require a trim
- The hedge on the left hand side of Calverts Garth requires a trim
- The handrail at Hill House needs remounting higher up as soon as possible
- The hedge on the opposite side of the road from the Lower Village Green requires a trim
- The ginnel from East End requires tidying up at ground floor level
- The hedge outside 26 Castle Side needs taking back 3 feet from the path
- The open space in The Croft requires the grass to be cut
- Attention needs to be given to the overhanging trees down Daskett Hill and Cornborough Road

Through them today we have Terri home where she is making tremendous progress towards a complete recovery. The Yorkshire Air Ambulance service is there for everyone who needs it. On this occasion it was for Terri.

It's costs £7,000 per day to operate. They receive no official funding.
