

The Meeting on 13th November 2009 was attended by Cllrs D Wooles (Chairman) , D Weston , Mrs P Bean , B Parkinson and I Read .Clerk BC Taylor (878060). Apologies were received from Cllrs Mrs J Calvert (Vice Chairman) and N Anfield. County Cllr Mrs Clare Wood (Hovingham and Sheriff Hutton Division) and District Cllr Eric Hope (Sheriff Hutton Ward) were present as guests.

Restricted Parking in Main Street

County Cllr Mrs Wood stated that there had been no objections to the advertising of the intended works. The legal department at NYCC had been instructed to draft the necessary documentation and this will be completed as soon as possible. Cllr Mrs Wood agreed to investigate the 3 months trial period promised at the site meeting with NYCC.

Matrix in Sheriff Hutton

The Fire Service has a Matrix, which they install on a temporary basis in Villages to find out the full extent of traffic problems. Sheriff Hutton is on the waiting list for this matrix and it is hoped that it will be in place for a while in February 2010. The Clerk will arrange a site visit to discuss with NYCC.

Right of Way in Sheriff Hutton Park

The registration of the Right of Way applied for by Sheriff Hutton PC has been held up by one of the landowners over which the proposed way passes. The land is now up for sale and Councillors remain keen to pursue the application. County Cllr Mrs Wood will pass this information on to NYCC

So when it comes to Christmas, I do hope that you have a good celebration in whichever way that you normally celebrate. Have a good feast, and enjoy the time. But spare a thought as well for the idea of a vulnerable God, a God who wants to participate in our lives. Marvel at the idea that the immortal and powerful God who created the universe, came to live amongst us as a tiny baby born into humble circumstances, to bring us back to God.

Fieldnats

12 members were present including our newest, baby Emma. After a few technical hitches we enjoyed a talk on the RSPB's Volunteer and Farmer Alliance project that Andy Chapman, our speaker, has been a part of over the past 10 years. He showed us survey techniques and how this years survey on the farm he manages, yielded a record 79 species of birds. He explained the work that RSPB volunteers have done over the last decade and how they have surveyed over 350,000 hectares, an area four times the size of Nottinghamshire: 77,000 hours of work have gone towards this project, a donation of time worth over £450,000. Whilst surveying over 4,250 farms across the UK, they have walked the equivalent of 4.5 times round the world to help farmers go the extra mile to support the nature on their land.

Next Meeting: Wednesday 2nd December, start 7pm in the Village Hall refreshment room. Theme: **Ringin'! (birds not bells)**, by Mrs. and Mr. P. Prosser who will discuss what ringin' is, give a little background history, look at the purpose of ringin' and in particular it's scientific applications. Finally we will be walked through "how do we do that?" bit, from catching birds through to their release and all that goes on in between!

We have had a very exciting and busy start to the school year. Here is a summary of some of the things each class has been doing:

Class One

During the summer holidays the builders came in to their class and fitted all new toilets and sinks and a shower. They also built a pergola and fitted some very colourful outside awnings so that the children in this class can play outside at any time of the year

Four new children started in the class in September and they have settled in really well. For Harvest festival they drew some fantastic sunflower pictures.

They are now very busy rehearsing for the Christmas play in December and will be getting some new classmates in January.

Class Two

This class have been given a new pet to keep and look after. He is a giant African snail and he is called Freddy. At the Harvest Festival they learnt all about different types of potatoes. They are a very small class but in January they will be joined by some of class one. They had a very interesting day out in York to visit Clifford's tower as they have been learning about castles and they walked along the city walls.

Class Three

This class visited RAF Linton on Ouse to learn about the weather and also about life in the RAF. It was really interesting. They have also been chosen to take part in a music event. For this they have been allowed to choose an instrument to learn for a year. The instruments are a flute, tuba, clarinet or a trumpet. They are really enjoying this. They also joined class four to take part in the giant planetarium visit which was an inflatable planetarium that filled the entire hall. It was very interesting.

Class Four

This is our class. We have spent this term basing most of our work on the Space theme. We have made space buggies, written space diaries, made rockets, written sci-fi stories and watched Apollo13. We then produced an assembly for our parents which they really enjoyed. The year 6 children went on a trip to Easingwold School to build a giant tetrahedron. They have been very busy taking part in lots of sporting events in the area, and the football and netball teams are both doing very well. They have been to a cross-country event, which was also very exciting. The year 5 and 6 boys won the event and will go through to represent the area in December.
