The **Parish Council Meeting** on 9th January 2009 was attended by Cllrs D Weston (Chairman), D Wooles (Vice Chairman), Mrs J Calvert, B Parkinson, Mrs P Bean, N Anfield and I Read. Clerk BC Taylor (878060).

County Councillor Mrs Clare Wood and District Councillor Eric Hope were also present. Mr Adrian Wilford of '4 Youth' and Mr Ian Waines, a Field Development Officer, both representing North Yorkshire Youth, were also present as guests. The Sheriff Hutton Youth Club Committee Members and 7 members of the public were also present.

Presentation of Roles and Responsibility of the North Yorkshire Youth Teams in NYCC

Mr Adrian Wilford gave a presentation outlining the function of '4 Youth' in the North Yorkshire area. He is responsible for managing a number of Youth Services, provided by NYCC, throughout Ryedale. These are based mainly in market towns and provide a broad spectrum of support and motivation for the young people of the area in various walks of life and in various age groups.

Mr Ian Waines represents the Youth Work Development Team whose role is to provide support and ideas to Voluntary Youth Groups in North Yorkshire. His area of responsibility is Scarborough and Ryedale. Mr Waines provided a written overview of the role of his department to the Councillors.

Bus Service 181: Variation in Timetable: Letter from NYCC 30/12/08

The Parish Council will monitor the timetables put up at the various bus stops. It was noted that the variation of timetable will probably only last until the end of March 2009.

Planning Applications

08/001095/FUL: Mrs Helen Hill; Siting of 15 no. static holiday caravans on part of approved touring caravan site at Land at OS Field 0055 York Road Sheriff Hutton York.

Several members of the Public attended the Meeting to voice their concerns over this Application. An original Application had been made in 2006 for the Caravan Site and Permission had been given with very many conditions to be applied to the development. The general view was that these conditions had not been fully satisfied in the matter of screening of the Site. The new Application also requested permission for the inclusion of Static Caravans at the Site, in addition to those Touring Caravans already applied for. The general feeling was that this would create a much more Commercial Operation with increased volume of traffic and a resulting Urbanisation of the area. Councillors agreed unanimously to oppose the Application, citing those objections made regarding the previous Application which had become even more relevant.

08/01097/FUL: Mr William Fairclough: Erection of two-storey extension at 2 Stonelands Close Sheriff Hutton York YO60 6SG

Councillors agreed to support the Application in its current form.

08/01111/FUL: Mr Richard Dales: Change of use and alteration of barn to form a two-bedroom dwelling with parking and amenity space at West Mill House, Stittenham Hill, Bulmer York YO60 7TP
Councillors agreed to support the Application in its current form.

Appeal APP/Y2736/A/08/209106/NWF: Erection of detached building, forming agricultural vehicle store, garage and tack room (revised details to refused 07/00943/FUL dated 13/12/07) at Long Acre The Green Sheriff Hutton York YO60 6SB

Councillors agreed to continue their opposition to this Application. The Clerk will write to the Planning Inspectorate to confirm this and forward a copy of the original letter of opposition.

Jesus is the light of the world. I have always been impressed by the idea of Jesus as the light of the world. We proclaim this at the darkest time of the year in the middle of winter. We are very used to this idea and image of Jesus but what we are not so used to is the idea of darkness. I remember many years ago I was walking through an old disused railway tunnel. The tunnel went round a bend and at one point the darkness was so dark you could not see any image of your hand in front of your face. Then a tiny dot of light appeared which grew into the exit from the tunnel. In these days of electric light bulbs we are not as familiar with darkness as the people of Jesus would have been. A light in the darkness makes a whole world of difference, it brings hope and safety and reassurance.

The idea that Jesus came into the world to bring light is a marvellous image and reminds me of this tunnel experience. But after Christmas the nights start to get shorter. The light of day starts to re-establish itself and days get longer. This happens slowly at first and then more and more rapidly until in mid Summer we have the lightest time of the year.

So the light of Jesus spreads through our world. Slowly bringing light to all of the world. I find that a wonderful and reassuring image, that God's light of the Kingdom is continuing to spread to every part of the world. So we continue to pray for the light to lighten up every part of our village. Jesus lighten our darkness, and bring us ever closer to your eternal light.
