Dear Friends

What is God like? We have a whole host of different words that we use to describe some of God's activity. We talk about a Creator, Redeemer, Saviour and Friend. We talk about God as a Father and we have many other different ways to describe God. We even talk about God as a Trinity, in other words that we understand God in three different ways. God the Creator who made the world, Jesus the Son who came to live and die for us, and God the Holy Spirit who is present with us in our own lives. Each of these images tries to help us at least to try to describe something of what God is about. In fact it is easier to talk about what God does, than it is to talk about what God is like or try to describe God.

I was challenged a few years ago about my image of Jesus. It came from a documentary about Jesus from the BBC's correspondent in Israel. In the documentary it said that Jesus almost certainly had short hair. That is a very trivial detail but I found it difficult to imagine Jesus with short hair. But that was the fashion at the time, which we are told about by Paul. It then struck me that my image of Jesus, in the flesh, must be a composite of all of the pictures and drawings that I have seen of him over the years. All of which seem to portray him with long hair!

But that reminds me that all of the pictures or images or even words that we use to describe God are only descriptions. They are like a finger that points to the moon. The picture or the image is just the finger, but it points to something else, something beyond it, to the moon. So our images of God and our descriptions of God as Saviour, or Redeemer, are not God but only an idea that points us towards God. God is much greater and more diverse than any description that we might try to make. That is something to remember when we think about speaking to others about God.
