#### **Parish Council News**

The **Annual Parishioners Meeting** on 10<sup>th</sup> April 2009 was attended by Cllrs D Weston (Chairman), D Wooles (Vice Chairman), B Parkinson, Mrs P Bean, N Anfield, and I Read. Clerk BC Taylor (878060). Apologies were received from Cllr Mrs J Calvert.

One member of the Public attended and County Councillor Mrs Clare Wood was present.

**The Chairman's Report:** The Chairman gave a report of the work of the Council for the last twelve months. This is available on the Parish Website <a href="https://www.sheriffhutton.co.uk">www.sheriffhutton.co.uk</a> or on application to the Parish Clerk.

**Damage to the Village Green:** A Parishioner raised the question of problems around the Village Green caused by the passage of vehicles using it resulting in the road around it being widened. She asked the Parish Council to ask Ryedale DC to offload their vehicles elsewhere.

**Parish Plan:** It was also mentioned that action needed to be taken to follow up the proposals in the Parish Plan as soon as possible so that parishioners do not lose interest. The Chairman stated that a meeting was scheduled to take place soon to discuss the Plan and the way ahead.

The Chairman closed the Meeting and thanked County Councillor Mrs Wood for attending.

The **Parish Council Meeting** then followed. All Councillors and County Councillor Mrs Wood remained for the meeting.

Parking in the Main Street: Councillors considered the proposals from NYCC for Parking restrictions suggested for the Main Street in the area of the Post Office. The Chairman will discuss these proposals with the proprietors of the Garage and the Post Office and report back to the Parish Council. County Councillor Mrs Wood offered her assistance in liaising with NYCC if required.

**Village Walks:** The Chairman stated that he is having difficulties concluding the final arrangement with NYCC for funding for the Village Walks. Mrs Wood said that she would liaise with the officer at NYCC to move the matter on.

#### **Emergency repairs to South-West Tower of Sheriff Hutton Castle**

Sheriff Hutton Castle is a prominent land mark in the village and indeed in North Yorkshire, it can be seen from as far away as the Howardian Hills and on a clear day even from York. But its importance extends beyond the local area and is recognised in the designation of the remains as a Scheduled Monument and a Grade II\* listed building – reflecting the site's national importance.

In 1999 the site was placed on English Heritage's Buildings at Risk register and since then we have been working with the owner to help find a solution to secure its future. This began in 2002 when English Heritage funded work to the North East tower. But more work is needed as the South West tower is in a perilous state and is in danger of collapsing. We are concerned that any collapse would significantly detract from the striking visual presence of the Castle. Whilst English Heritage has comparatively little funding and calls on its money are great, we recognise the importance of this magnificent site and are therefore providing further funding to put ties into the top part of the South West tower, remove the vegetation and undertake some pointing work. This should stabilise the structure.

However this is a short term solution, ideally we would like to see all the standing remains fully repaired and strengthened and more opportunities for the public to get close to and learn about the castle. But it is unlikely that we will be able to find anymore public money to put into the site. These works will 'buy some time' and we will continue to work with the owner and the local community to try and find a longer term solution.

#### Forgiveness ....

One of the serving maids sitting at the fire noticed him, then took a second look and said, "This man was with him". He denied it, "Woman, I don't even know him." A short time later, someone else noticed him and said, "You're one of them." But Peter denied it: "Man, I am not." About an hour later, someone else spoke up, really adamant: "He's got to have been with him! He's got 'Galilean' written all over him. Peter said, "Man, I don't know what you're talking about." At that very moment, the last word hardly off his lips, a rooster crowed. Just then, the Master turned and looked at Peter. Peter remembered what the Master had said to him: "Before the rooster crows, you will deny me three times." He went out and cried and cried and cried.

I wonder if there is anything in your life that when you see, hear, smell or touch it reminds you of some past failure or hurt? For Peter it was the sounds of the Cockerel announcing a fresh start, a new beginning of another day. But Peter could not hear that, all Peter heard was his own failure.

Later on Jesus restores Peter and shows him forgiveness, but I wonder what Peter's response was to hearing that sound again after knowing the grace that Jesus showed him?

I think that there are two ways of dealing with our past failures. One, we can wallow in the pain and beat ourselves up, or two we can see them from the other side as moments that announce a turning point in who we are.

The difference, I believe is God's forgiveness....

This week take some time to think through those past hurts, ask God to forgive you and give you the power to forgive those who hurt you, then go back and find the thing that reminds you of it, but this time embrace it as a sign of God's new beginning.
